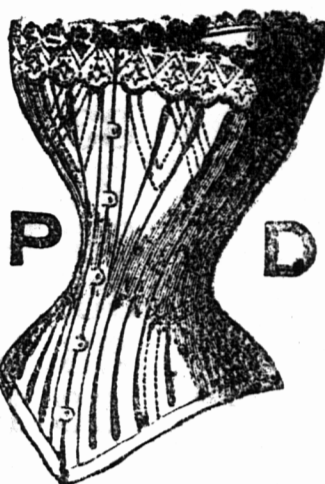
There has been a great rush of miners to Clear City, where seven hundred claims are already recorded.
