

Football Season To Open Here Next Saturday Afternoon

The 1947 football season will get underway here next Saturday afternoon with Prince of Wales and Saint Dunstan's Varsity teams clashing in an exhibition encounter, it was learned last night.

Both squads have been going through tough practice sessions the past couple of weeks or so and are rapidly rounding into shape and when the two rivals pry the lid off the season.

Each squad has a number of all-time champions who have been particularly well known in the past. The Prince of Wales team includes the appearance of Brutus McLeod star forward of 1941 and 1942 squads, McLeod who played with Acadia the past couple of seasons and who has re-entered Prince of Wales will prove a tower of strength to the local collegians and the dark outlook for retaining their Island college title which they have held for the past seven years has been considerably brightened with McLeod's unlooked for appearance.

Armed Wins Match Race

NEW YORK, Sept. 28 (AP) — Armed defeated Assault in their \$100,000 match race at Belmont Park Saturday.

Armed won by six lengths. A crowd of 51,573 turned out for the event. The time for the 1 1/4 miles was 2:02 4/5.

There was no betting on the race, because of recent uncertainty about Assault's condition. He turned up lame after a walk-out Thursday.

Each horse carried 126 pounds in the weight-for-age event. Armed led all the way, just as he was expected to do. Assault, winner of last year's triple crown, made one move, and as they were rounding the stretch turn, but after pulling up to be back again, despite Araro's urging with the whip.

The match, talked of since last winter as the race of the year, was on a winner-take-all basis. The \$100,000 purse boosted Armed's earnings to \$742,900, as he came within \$5,000 of overhauling Assault at the head of the turf's all-time money-winning list.

Owner Warren Wright had said that if the six-year-old Armed, ranked with Exterminator as the greatest geldings in history, won, he would donate the net proceeds — some \$75,000 — to charity.
