HEARST'S DEFEAT STILL THE TALK

(Continued from page 4.)

"In my judgment the recent issue of the book called the 'English Hymnal' has made it necessary for me to speak in public of my anxiety. My chief objection to the book is that it is a direct attempt to introduce into the service of the Church of England under cover of hymns, requests addressed to saints for their prayers in our behalf. I am clear that my only course is to prohibit the use of the 'English Hymnal' in the public services of the church at this time."

The Bishop of Exeter also declared: "The hymnal in question if adopted or allowed would have the effect of replacing in the public services of our Church the invocation of saints, now deliberately excluded from all of our authoritative formularies. So grave a step ought not, it seems to me to be attempted by a side wind. Accordingly until such hymns as I have referred to are removed from the book I feel bound not only to refuse my sanction to the use of the book, but to decline to be present at any service in which the book is used."

The question of the authority of the bishops to prohibit the book has been raised in many quarters. Several hymns in "Hymns Ancient and Modern," which are claimed by the Low Church party to be objectionable as any in the "English Hymnal" have been pointed out by Mr. Miller, Secretary of the Church Association. They include: "At the cross her station keeping," "Shall we not love thee, Mother dear?" "Oh! Hear that awful cry!" "Faithful ones, above all other," "Thorns and crosses, nails and lance," "That last night at supper lying."

Once more the Channel Tunnel scheme is being brought forward and this time with a force of favorable opinion behind it. It is no secret that certain members of the Cabinet have recently talked over the matter and approve the proposal, that the Admiralty are not opposed to it, and that the Imperial Defence Committee will soon have the subject brought before them for consideration. Influential forces are now behind the project, and it may be made a success."
