AGRICULTURAL WORK.—The agricultural work done by the Department of Agriculture in Prince Edward Island during last year is interestingly reviewed by the Secretary of Agriculture, Mr. T. Ross, in a recent number of "The Agricultural Gazette of Canada," the new publication which has been introduced by the Minister of Agriculture. At the outset the writer states: "On account of the financial aid received from the Federal Department of Agriculture, the lines of work that were being carried on by the Provincial Department were pushed with greater energy and extended, and several new ones were undertaken." The various features dealt with in the article are a short course, dairymen's association, seed fairs, horse shows, new organizations, summer school for teachers, field crop competitions, demonstration in sheep dipping, extension of the work in poultry, progress of farmers' institutes, new buildings erected, and work done through the previous agricultural instruction act. The article is illustrated with a view of the Agricultural Hall and annex, in Charlottetown, and the short course class room in this hall.
