Fire Destroys Home For Aged

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) ST. BASIL, N. B., Feb. 25—Recently converted into a home for the aged, a Roman Catholic convent built in 1877 lay in fire-swept ruins tonight on a small overlooking the parish of St. Basil, Madawaska County, Paris of adjoining new stone buildings containing the Hotel Dieu Hospital, chapel, boys' and girls' quarters and sisters' home were damaged by fire and water. Sisters of the order estimated the loss at \$25,000.
