manity, which is the cause of God, they have found their lives again in our priceless heritage, found them again around the Great White Throne. For what are these that are arrayed in white robes, and whence came they? These are they which came out of great tribulation, multitudes which no man can number, including our gallant defenders who have fallen in battling for the Lord against the Mighty.

"And ever near, although unseen. The dear immortal spirit tread. For all the boundless universe is life, there are no dead."

His Lordship the Chief Justice, Hon. J. A. Mathieson, then in a brief address, befitting the occasion, unveiled the Honour Roll. It was fitting, he said, that such an honour roll should be found in those places which we deem most sacred. It was a roll inscribed with the names of men and women who had felt themselves called upon and had responded to the call of duty, involving more danger and more sacrifice than had fallen upon any of our people for generations. In the history of the world men and women had never been called to a higher duty, nor to face dangers that were greater, nor to guard against possibilities of loss that were so overwhelming. We are safe at home, he said, because we are guarded by the strong arms and strong hearts of the men along the battle lines and by the brave men on the seas in those grim grey ships that guard the ocean. We could give no honour too high nor recognition too deep to those to whom we owe so much. There was one great service that the young people could render, and that was to keep in mind and cherish and aid those who were suffering by reason of grief and anxiety over relatives at the front. In conclusion the Chief Justice said that for those who had fallen we shall not cease to mourn, nor shall we

cease to strive for the cause to which they have consecrated their lives until victory crowns the right. In the following words he unveiled the Honour Roll:

"I now unveil this 'Honour Roll' to the glory of God, in honored memory of those who have fallen in the great struggle, and as a mark of our appreciation of all who have rendered military service in this colossal, unparalleled and world-wide war, and I herewith deliver the same to the Minister of St. James' Church."

The Minister replied: "As representing those to whom the custody of the honour roll is now committed, I accept and take it over to be preserved with all reverent care, and now in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the authority committed to me in His Church, I dedicate it to the Glory of God and in remembrance of those who have fallen, and in appreciation of those who have rendered Military Service in the great war."




