COCK FIGHTING IN MONTREAL

MONTREAL March 27.—72 game cocks and 120 men were taken by one grand swoop at 10 o'clock this morning. To do the work required a squad of fifty-three policemen and a long line of patrol wagons. The whole outfit was taken to the Craig street police station, where the men who were known were allowed to go pending summons, but others were compelled to deposit \$50 each.

The game was in progress in a stable owned by Daniel Donnelly, master carter, Notre Dame Street, east, and the police had been warned by a woman that it was to come off. Inspector Lamouche kept his men ready for action. Even as early as four o'clock some of the participants began to arrive with bags under their arms. It was not, however, until almost ten that word was received of a fight being in actual progress. Then the police bore down upon the place. One loud knock caused the door to open, and when Inspector Lamouche saw the crowd he shouted that every person present was under arrest.

A wild rush was made for the doors, but uplifted batons of the police drove the revelers back. Some leaped from windows, only to be caught by men in uniform below, while others took refuge in the hay loft, under vehicles and amongst the horses. Perhaps half a dozen managed to escape. The ones taken ranged in age from eighteen to seventy years. The cocks, some of which had records, and were valued as high as \$60, will be given as supplies to charitable institutions. It is said that if the raid had been deferred until the afternoon 500 men would have been captured.
