WILLIAM CRABBE

William Crabbe, prominent mining man, of Chico, died suddenly of heart disease on a Southern Pacific train between Marysville and Chico yesterday afternoon, says a Californian exchange, while he was enroute to his home here from San Francisco. He had been in San Francisco for the last ten days, undergoing treatment by a specialist. Deceased was a native of Prince Edward Island, and was sixty-four years old October 23 last. He had been in California thirty-four years, most of which period had been devoted to mining activities in Butte county. He had interests in the Magallowa ridge district. At the time of his death his home was on "S. Crestnut street, Chico. Surviving are his widow, Levina P. Crabbe; five children, Mrs. Eleanor McLean of Portland, John H. Crabbe, of San Francisco, and John, Lemuel and Benjamin Crabbe of Shasta county, and relatives in the east. Funeral arrangements have not been made.

ANOTHER WAR PROPHECY

The war will be over in March or April, according to Mrs. Rose Crittendon, of New York, recently returned to Brockton, Mass., after eight years in Germany who spoke at the "Public Forum." She told of her experiences in trying to get out of Germany, saying it had taken her a year and cost her \$5,000 to get away with her three children. At Hanover she incautiously displayed a small American flag as she was boarding a train and afterwards was closely watched. At Hamburg she was obliged to disrobe and submit to search. Her shoes for which she had paid \$20, were taken from her and she was given a pair of wooden ones. One of her sons, Mrs. Crittendon said, was nearly forced to serve in the Kaiser's army. Two American boys, she added, were forced to serve because they were unable to produce their naturalization papers. The speaker declared that the German people have been slowly starving for the past year and that the war has given rise to terrible disease.
