Mr. Morrison, who is accompanied by Henry H. Fisher, cashier of the Bank in Washington, where the American Federation of Labor funds are kept, is to be asked about the disposition of \$225,000 raised for the defence of the McNamara brothers.

Whatever financial dealings, if any, the International Association of Bridge Construction had with the Federation since McNamara's arrest, is also to be enquired into.

Before the arrest of McNamara, the secretary-treasurer of the Iron Workers was allowed \$10,000 a month, for which he was not required to give any account, but which Orrie McManigal, a confessed dynamiter, says was used to pay for explosives and to pay men to blow open shop structures.

It was while going over these accounts that the Grand Jury, it is said, decided to go into the finances of the Iron Workers.

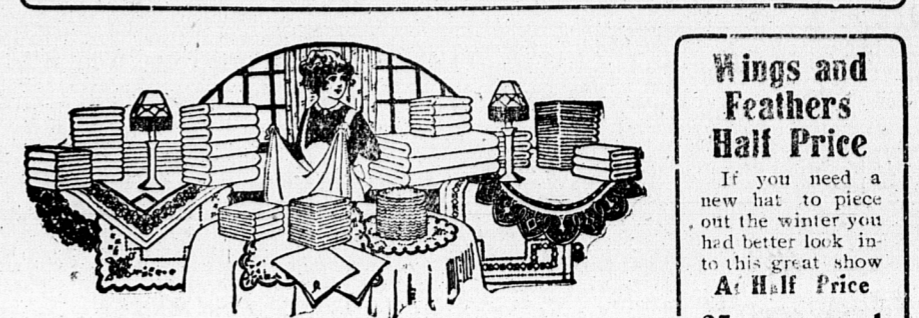
