Jews' Windows Broken and Personal Injury Threatened

Another Massacre Feared—Seri Indians on the War Path—Epidemic of Pneumonia in Chicago—Many Deaths.

CHICAGO, Dec. 28.—(Special)—The hospitals are full of pneumonia cases and 130 deaths from that disease occurred last week.

SNOW AND ICE ON SIDEWALKS

Will Have to be Removed by the Citizens

The Bye Laws to be Passed by the City Council—Fines will be Imposed if Work is not Done.

A special meeting of the City Council was held yesterday afternoon with reference to passing a bye law relating to the removal of snow and ice from the sidewalks of the city.

His Worship Mayor Warburton was in the chair and all the Council were present but Messrs Stewart and Moore.

The act in substance is as follows:—Every tenant or occupant of any building or lot of land and in case there is no tenant the owner or the agent of the owner or any person having the care of land bordering on the streets or lanes of the city shall after the ceasing or falling of such snow—if in the daytime within four hours after, and if at night before ten o'clock next day cause such snow to be removed and levelled off towards the centre of the street so as not to close up the gutter or waterway, the gutter also to be kept open and free from all obstructions under a penalty of \$2 for every such neglect, and further of \$1 each day snow shall not be removed. Also in case of ice the walk shall be made safe by removing the ice or covering the same with ashes, sand or other suitable substance, and in case such owner, tenant, occupant, or care taker shall neglect to do so, for the space of two hours during the day time, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of \$2 for every such neglect and a like sum for every day such neglect shall be continued.

The bye law also provided for levelling of snow placed on the street and to prevent placing of snow in the river ice within 1200 feet from the shore or 200 feet from the brushed track. The bill was read a first time, read a second time referred to committees of the whole Council with Councillor Hooper in the chair and set down for third reading this morning at half past nine.
