OTTAWA, Feb. 8 (CP)—Some of the more important financial legislation of the year is expected to come before the House of Commons this week with the debate on the speech from the Throne still in progress. Finance Minister Isley is believed anxious to get two measures before the House, a bill dealing with the allocation of munitions and a measure which will govern Canada's financial transactions with the United Kingdom and replace the \$1,000,000,000 gift bill of last session.

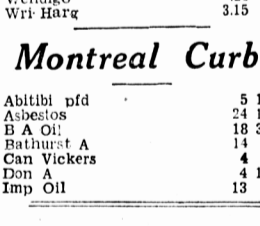

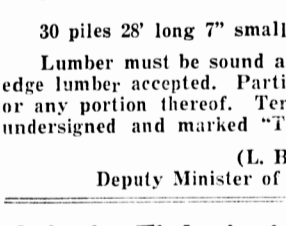

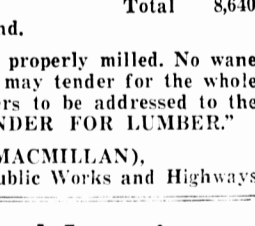
