Rev. M. J. Rooney Learns Soldier-Brother Is Safe

Rev. M. J. Rooney, Bloomfield, P.E.I., has received the joyful news that his brother, Sgt. Plus Bernard Rooney, was released on April 22, from one of the German Stalag prison camps by the Russian army after almost fifteen months of internment.

First news of his liberation came on May 17, through the American Red Cross. On the following day a letter written by the Sergeant, himself, on May 4, was received by his parents, Joseph and Mrs. Rooney, Rendville, Mass. His parents were delighted to hear the good news because four months had elapsed from the time of the receipt of his previous letter.

He said he was in good health and glad to get away from barbed wire enclosures and German guards, and that he expected to be "homeward bound" very soon. Sgt. Rooney enlisted in the American army shortly after Pearl Harbor. He took his basic training in American Southern and Northern military encampments. He participated in the African, Sicilian and Italian campaigns, was wounded twice and received the Purple Heart and Oak Leaf decorations before being captured in Italy. He was formerly a student at St. Dunstan's University, Charlottetown.

Cabinet: This week Mr. King will preside over his first cabinet council meeting since April 19 when he left for the San Francisco world security conference. He has been informed by telegram and letter of decisions of cabinet in the interval.

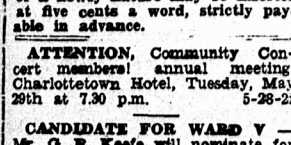
