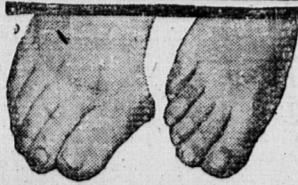

Special police had to be sworn in, as looting was openly indulged in, residents being forced to leave their homes unprotected. Mrs. Bourke told of the devastation she had seen, houses floating down from the hills, trees and debris of all kinds and water everywhere.

California Has Earthquake

(Canadian Press.) LOS ANGELES, Calif., Nov. 5.—A series of earthquakes here starting at 3 a. m. and recurring at intervals until 7.30 a. m., shook towns along the California coast from Los Angeles to Watsonville Junction. It was also felt by towns in the interior of the state and the United States magnetic observatory seismograph at Tucson, Ariz., recorded "very severe" disturbances. Little damage was reported.
