HIGH PRICE OF DAWSON STAMP

Dawson, N. T., Feb. 19.—George Rogers, who worked on the big dam on Bonanza, has a very curious story to tell of a West Australian postage stamp that brought no less than £100 when recently sold in London.

"It is just my luck," he began. "In 1903 I wrote to a friend of my family in England from West Australia, a man named Fletcher, who lives at Haughton, Durham county, England. Well, I've just got a letter from him that the blooming stamp on that letter fetched four hundred quid in London. That's luck, ain't it?"

"This is what the letter says. I'll read it to you. I kept that envelope for some years, as the stamp seemed to me something of a curiosity. Then Billy Robinson, your sister's son, came along and he begged it off me. He is quite a sharp chap on stamps and such like. Well, he advertises this stamp in Lloyd's News-papers in London, and it turns out that there are only eight of that kind in existence, although it was issued thirteen years ago. Well he sells it for £100. That one stamp. Think of it, George."

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON VIII.—February 24.

GOD'S COVENANT WITH ABRAHAM.

Gen. 15, 1, 2, 6. Memorize verses 5, 6.

GOLDEN TEXT.

He believed in Jehovah; and he reckoned it to him for righteousness.—Gen. 15, 6.

EXPLANATIONS.

1. "After those things"—The events narrated in the preceding chapter. "The word of Jehovah came unto"—The inspiration frequently used to designate the prophetic revelation. A common form of revelation was that of "a vision." In Gen. 12 and 13, earlier promises of God to Abraham are recorded. The long delay in the fulfillment of these promises further tests the strength of his faith. Having endured the test, two special assurances are given him that God's promises will surely be fulfilled. The following narratives set forth the further moral training and probation to which Abraham is subjected, until at last the perfect man of God, the pattern of faith for all coming generations, stands out in bold relief from the rest of the narrative. "And thy exceeding great reward"—Or, thy reward shall be exceeding great (marginal reading).

2. "Number the stars"—Count them. "He," that is, Jehovah, "revealed it to him," Abraham, "for righteousness."—Abraham lived before the law of Moses was given, hence his righteousness could not be that of obedience to this formal law. His trust in and devotion to God, though more general in character, was, nevertheless, deep and true.

3. For events, referred to, comp. 11, 23, 12, 7; 13, 15; 14, 9-11, 17. "The promise is ratified by a covenant, in which the contracting parties pass between the
