that the Assembly is constituted as Mr. Munroe claims it to be, but that, I submit, does not make it a representative body. This very fact that the General Assembly at Winnipeg stood 406 to 90 in favor of union while the people stood 113,000 to 73,735 in favor, should prove to any unbiased mind that the Assembly does not represent the people in the matter of church union.

Take Pictou Presbytery, the people stood for union 2,506; against 4,726. Yet the thirteen commissioners sent to the General Assembly all voted for union. Those men did not represent the attitude of the church in Pictou on the question of union.

Again, take the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island, the majority of the people, I am satisfied are against union, yet the clergy I am told are eight to one in favor of union. At any rate I am told the commissioners proposed to be sent to the General Assembly are four to one in favor of union. In this proportion they do not represent the people.

Mr. T. B. Kilpatrick, Knox College, Toronto, says that the General Assembly is the church itself, acting in its representative capacity and I have shown that on the question of union it does not represent the people. Yet it proposes to legislate the Presbyterian Church out of existence in Canada, and it makes an appeal to the loyalty of the people to support the highest court in their church in this action.

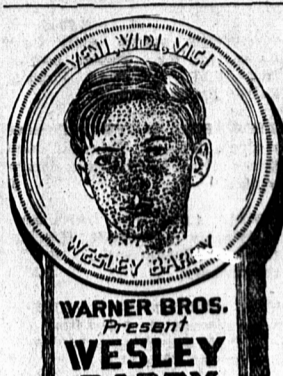

"They had 'slates' prepared and every man on the slate a unionist." They allowed an ardent unionist who neither proposed nor seconded a motion to occupy all the time he wanted on the floor of the Presbytery of which he took full advantage and then the Presbytery "strangled debate and would allow no reply." This is the low policy adopted at the Mont-
