Thinks Japan Is Getting Ready For War

Declares Forts Are Being Hastily Erected at Many Strategic Points. Similar Preparations are Taking Place in the Japanese Navy.

St. PETERSBURG, October 17.—General Linevitch commander in chief of the Russian Siberian army, has reported to the general staff in St. Petersburg as follows:—

"The Japanese government is erecting hastily in Manchuria and Korea fortifications and sending enormous quantities of ammunition to the place. Under disguise of various business enterprises they are buying properties from Chinamen in all the strategically important points adjoining around Vladivostok and Blagoveshchensk, to accumulate the ammunition. "Hundreds of similar cases indicate the preparations of war. Similar preparations are reported in the navy and in

the harbor of Korsakoff, in Saghalien. A special detailed report will follow by courtier."

HAD ARRESTED TWO JAP SPIES.

At the time this dispatch was sent by General Linevitch the Russian police had arrested two Japanese spies near Blagoveshchensk disguised as Russian telegraph officials, who were making topograph measurements and notes around the forts in Siberia. Important notes and maps have been found in their baggage. They explain themselves to be in the service of a private American telegraph company, but it is believed they are special engineers of the Japanese general staff.

As waste the case before the last war, the whole Russian Pacific coast and the adjoining points having forts of strategic importance in Siberia are again filled with the Japanese spies. Daily reports from Eastern Siberia show the relation the Russians and the Japanese between people is becoming more and more hostile.
