#### BIG SCHEME AFOOT FOR MILITARY STUDENTS

TORONTO, Dec. 12.—A Globe Despatch from Ottawa, says a big scheme is afoot for the turning out annually 300 or 400 university students in Canada, as trained officers of the Canadian Militia. It has been developed by Hon. Sam Hughes, and Lord Strathcona has given \$100,000 for this scheme at McGill, and Major Leonard Chairman of National Transcontinental Commission, lands and buildings at Queen's Kingston, approximately valued at half a million. Mr. Hughes is now after other wealthy Canadians donations for the universities of Toronto and New Brunswick.

SAD DEATH.—Mr. William Deegan, Emerald, received a telegram yesterday morning announcing the sudden death of his son-in-law Mr. George Lindsay, which took place at his residence in Summerville, Mass., on Thursday.

SPLENDID PORK.—Mr. W. Pigot, shipped pork at Mt. Stewart on Wednesday last. Mr. Pigot has been handling pork for many years and never saw it put on the market in better condition than this year. Six month old hogs are averaging two hundred pounds. Mr. John McIntyre killed a pig this week seven months old, that tipped the scale at 292 lbs. (without the organs). Mr. H. Coffin, butchered one 6 months old that weighed two hundred and fifty. The writer noticed several challenges in The Guardian, but is of the opinion that Mr. Stewart compares favorably in the weight of pork with any other farming district on the Island.

ISLANDER'S SUDDEN DEATH.—The many friends of Mr. T. J. Cumiskey, a native of Port Augustus, in this Province will be grieved to hear of his death which occurred in St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver, following an operation in November 21st. A few weeks previous to that Mr. Cumiskey was Inspector of Indian Agencies for Yale-Cariboo and Kootenay, made a trip through the Okanagan and Similkameen with the Indian Commission. On one occasion the auto in which he was riding became stuck and in lifting it he complained that he had strained himself and afterward at intervals, he suffered from slight pains, but a few days before his death internal bleeding set in and he was informed that an operation was necessary. He went into the Hospital on Thursday, the operation took place on Friday morning and he died that night. Mr. Cumiskey was about fifty-six years of age and leaves a widow and one daughter to mourn the loss of a loving husband and kind father. (Other papers please copy.)
