—The latest news first of all.

—Miss Effie McDonald has arrived from Winnipeg to visit her home in Summerside.

—Potatoes were selling in Summerside yesterday at eighteen to twenty cents and turnips at thirteen cents.

—Religious meetings are being held in Wilnot Hall every evening this week by Rev. W. B. Crowell of Summerside.

—At a recent basket social in Newcastle, N. B., L. B. McMurdo, formerly of Alberton, took part in a male quartette.

—There were 735 sheep, 3 cars of starch, 6 horses and 200 barrels of oysters shipped by the Empress from Summerside yesterday morning.

—Joseph McInnis of Charlottetown, is in Summerside and has taken the contract to paint the residence of George Godkin, collector of customs.

—There was quite a lot of produce moving in Summerside yesterday. The prices were the same as heretofore excepting on potatoes, which indicate a decline.

—William Craig, Summerside, met with a painful accident on Saturday last, while shingling a roof. While Mr. Craig experienced a severe shaking up, he was not seriously injured and will soon be around again.

—The Campana is due in Summerside this morning, where a large quantity of freight is awaiting her. This being her last trip it is quite probable that she will have an extra heavy freight from this port.

—J. Frank Lafferty, the Summerside reporter to this paper is confined to his home with tonsillitis, which accounts for the scarcity of news for this column, but it is hoped that Frank will soon be out and at it again.

—Butter is selling in Summerside from twenty two to twenty six cents eggs seventeen and one half to eighteen and one half cents; Hay loose nine dollars a ton; straw four fifty; black oats forty and white oats thirty eight cents.

—The schooner Calabria which was drifted ashore on Salutation Cove on November first was relieved of her dangerous position last Sunday by the tug James Reid and was brought to Summerside, where she now lies, awaiting the arrival of a tug to take her to Pictou, where she will go on the Marine slip to undergo repairs, which fortunately are not serious.
