### PROF. DYDE LEAVES QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY.

KINGSTON, Ont., Oct. 20.—At a meeting at Queen's University, the trustees, last night, accepted the resignation of Prof. S. W. Dyde, as head of the department of mental philosophy, with regret, and a resolution was passed expressing the university's appreciation of Prof. Dyde's valuable services during the past eighteen years. Prof. Dyde becomes principal of the new Presbyterian College at Strathcona, Alberta, at the first of the year.  
The trustees decided to hold a special meeting on Nov. 16 to take up the question of a change in the constitution by removing the ties that bind Queen's to the Presbyterian church, which question was again referred back by the General Assembly.

NAVAL SUPREMACY OF BRITAIN NEVER SO MARKED AS NOW

LONDON, Oct. 20.—Hon. Mr. Balfour, speaking at Glasgow, dealt with imperial defence. He said that the islands were strategically the gate of the defences of the Empire. He would resist the temptation to deal with the question of how far responsibility for protection of the Empire should be shared by the self-governing colonies; the initiative in this respect must come from them. M. Balfour referred to the relative strength of Britain and other powers in 1905 and 1910 and said that never in any other period of British naval history had there been such a change.  
He urged the necessity for a solid safety in the capital. Ships of two power standard, he said, were more necessary than ever. Other countries could build as fast as Britain. The admiralty was ill-informed as to what nations were doing and might at any moment be confronted with the utmost peril and without warning. Britain could no longer wait and see what other countries were doing but must see to it they did not get ahead.  
Reginald McKenna, speaking at a luncheon, said Mr. Balfour's remarks were always synchronous with his followers' demands for a leap upon tariff reform. He reckoned 1, first class battleships Britain more than maintained the two-power standard, and in first-class cruisers her superiority was still more marked. Never had the margin of superiority been so high in times of peace.  
Mr. McKenna also denied Mr. Balfour's figures respecting the number of German and British Dreadnought in 1913.

CINCINNATI, Ohio, Oct. 20.—At the meeting of the House of Bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church convention yesterday the canon on the subject of marriage and divorce was changed to prevent the marriage of anybody who has been divorced. Divorced persons, whether they be innocent or guilty of any of the acts which permit a divorce, cannot remarry in the church. The rectors of all churches will be notified of this action of the Episcopal convention and will govern themselves accordingly. The vote on the subject is not known, but it is said by the bishops to have been decisively in favor of the change.  
This canon has been one of the most important matters to be brought before the general convention. It has been talked of frequently by the bishops and the deputies, but no action such as that taken yesterday in the House of Bishops was considered probable. The new canon has many opponents among the bishops and the laity of the church. It was urged that innocent parties in divorces should not be ostracized by the church if they wished to remarry. Some of the churchmen have gone so far as to say that either party to a divorce should be allowed to marry again. The action of the church puts it in line with the rules in the Catholic Church.

### KILLED IN MISTAKE FOR MOOSE

TRURO, October 20.—A persistent rumor has been heard about town to day of a shooting accident in the woods near McCullum's settlement, in which a young man hailing from Harmsby, was killed by a companion while moose hunting. Owing to the isolated position of the place little information is procurable, but the story goes that a party while after moose, discovered a "yard," and made arrangements that no one should enter it until given a signal. It seems that the young man supposed to be killed did not obey orders and was shot in mistake for a moose. It was thought about town that a Truro young man was the unfortunate victim, but he and his companions returned to town safely.

### HORSES IN WINTER.

Good Feeding and Clean Water Important During This Period.

An experienced breeder says that yearlings and two-year-olds are large enough to rough it in winter. Put them in an open shed or feed lot, and when the weather is not too severe they will do well if turned out in pasture three or four hours during the middle of the day. As a general rule colts of this age are fed corn, but one must use his own judgment as to whether or not the colts are large enough. If oats are plentiful they should be fed at the rate of about a gallon of oats and a quart of bran to a feed. The feed racks should always be well filled with timothy or timothy and clover mixed and when the snow falls a little sweet straw.  
Care should be taken in feeding colts. It is a good plan to see that all the colts begin to eat at the same time. If this is not observed the ones starting late do not get enough, and after this has occurred they have a tendency to eat too rapidly and gorge. This often results in stomach staggers, which in some cases prove dangerous. Plenty of good, clean drinking water should be placed where they can get it whenever it is needed. Some people water their colts at regular intervals to prevent their getting too much and thus avoiding chills.  
If the brood mares are not used for heavy work they should be allowed to run on grass and rough it until the weather becomes too severe. In this way they will get plenty of exercise and be of little expense to the owner. In working colts mares great care should be observed. They should be fed during the winter about a gallon of oats to a quart of bran to a feed morning and evening. The noon ration should consist of a feed of corn. If the mare is being worked hard she should have more corn. A boiled feed at every week end will guard against week end diseases, which result from staling.
