# REDISTRIBUTION BILL

(Canadian Press.)  
OTTAWA, Feb. 10.—The Redistribution Bill will be introduced by Premier Borden in the House this afternoon when he will make a short statement explaining the principles which will be followed in making the new Redistribution.

It is expected that the committee to which the Bill will be referred for drafting the boundaries will be named at once. It will likely consist of nine members, five Conservatives and four Liberals. There will probably be two Maritime Provinces members, two from Quebec, two from Ontario, two from the Prairie Provinces and one from British Columbia.

### NEW CURE FOR POISON

It may be possible to eliminate a poison from a man's blood before it affects his system. This wonder of medicine was predicted by Dr. John Jacob Abel, professor of pharmacology of Johns Hopkins university, Baltimore, in an address at the meeting of the learned Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology. Dr. Abel, who belonged to many foreign societies, reported on early experiments to rid a man of poisons microbes by subjecting them to treatment even in his own blood vessels.

Dr. Abel's method includes the tapping of some central artery through which the entire blood supply must pass sooner or later. The blood is directed through a specially made tube of celluloid, which in turn is surrounded by a saline solution. The proximity of this special solution abstracts the poison as the blood flows through the tube.

Dr. W. A. Dandy, assistant professor of surgery at Johns Hopkins university, described experiments on dogs by which he had discovered that hydrocephalus is caused by the blocking of certain ducts and canals from the brain. He had produced the disease artificially in the animals, he said, and by looking for the cause in human being it is now hoped to effect a cure.

### SCHOOL DENTAL CLINIC FOR BRANTFORD PUPILS

BRANTFORD, Feb. 9.—A dental clinic will be established in connection with the Brantford public schools. This was unanimously decided by the Public School Board. Increases to the teachers' minimum and maximum salaries were put through. It was decided to refer the plans of the new Fawcett Street school back to the architects with instructions to cut down the cost, if they could, to \$50,000 or less, which the City Council is prepared to put up, the Aldermen having declined to grant \$60,000 which the Board has asked for on several occasions.

In this connection a large consignment of North American skunks has lately arrived, some of which will shortly be established by Mr. Mervyn Chute in a large hillside enclosure on his state in Northumberland. # Practical Fashion Hints



A smartly designed little skirt is shown in Number 7994. It closes at the side and has a slight fullness in the back which may be arranged in gathers or dart tucks. There is an effective shaped girdle, which may be used or not as preferred. While almost any material is suitable with this design, it seems especially appropriate to the heavier fabrics, such as tweed, ratin or one of the heavy stuffs used in golf and sport suits.

A simple and practical way of finishing plackets is as follows: Run a straight strip of the material about two inches wide down one side of the placket, turn at the bottom and bring it back on the other side; stitch it in a narrow seam; press it flat, fold in half and turn the edge in; either fell it down to the skirt by hand or stitch again with the machine. This is a quick, neat finish and prevents the placket from tearing down, as so often happens.

This skirt may be made in size 24 with 2 1/2 yards of 42 inch material. The pattern is cut in 8 sizes; 22 to 36.
