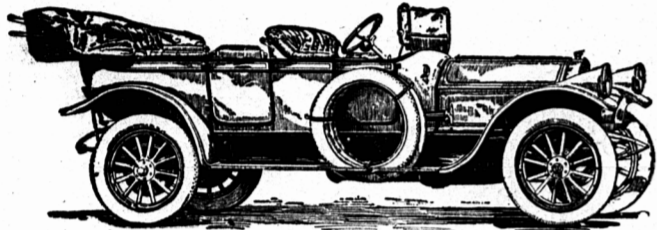

SEPTEMBER 14.
THE TEN COMMANDMENTS, II.
Exodus 20: 12-21.
GOLDEN TEXT.

"Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind, and thy neighbor as thyself." - Luke 10: 2.
POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

It is not difficult for the honorable person to render honor where it is due. The outgo of anything can scarcely exceed its income. Where, therefore, there is the expression of a righteous quality there is also the evidence of its existence. What son or daughter is willing to have the world believe in his incapacity for love because he fails to show it?

But there is one thing the world most surely believes in, and that is that fathers and mothers ought to be honored by their children; freely loved and gladly obeyed. The reaction of the world is most terrible against those who despise or make light of father or mother. The root of reverence for all authority is here. And reverence for authority is essential and fundamental to stable government and religious and national life.

The Sermon on the Mount must interpret for us the meaning of the commandments and the measure and method of their application in our day. The children of Israel failed in their obedience to them because they were satisfied to do so in the letter and not in the spirit of them. And it is well to notice how the commandments cover the full range of thoughts and words and deeds. Stimulus or check is not provided for what the hand may do, but also for what the tongue may speak and the mind and heart may think.

One may kill without sword or pistol. Murder is more a sin of the heart than a crime of the hand. Obedience to the commandments has a wider and far deeper beneficence than the saving of bloodshed. It not only would prevent the murder, but it also (and the rather) would save the murderer, for anger and hatred do their deadly work before any gun gets a chance.

"Thou shalt not commit adultery." It is not flattering to our times that the violation of this law of moral and physical cleanliness should need to be brought into notice to the extent that it has recently. The story of red light districts, of white slavery, of procuring, etc., etc., is painful reading, indeed. But if the teaching of Jesus demands purity in heart and in life, then all filthiness of the flesh and the spirit must be purged away.

The eight commandment convicts many men of theft - wrong-doings - who are not behind prison bars. But the rising tide of social and industrial sentiment against corporate methods of fleecing from labor and of squeezing profits from unearned increments is bringing the day near when the underhand sources of gain will be too hot to hold. The shop-lifter, the burglar, the highwayman are decency itself compared with the bloodsuckers of graft, monopoly, land exploitation, sweat-shops or any unjust source of gain.

The pit-diggers of character, the scandal-mongers of reputations, the prejudiced or bigoted persecutors of thought-provoking men, gossipers, slanders, tittle-tattlers, as well as all falsifiers when witnesses under oath, come under the condemnation of the ninth commandment. Covetousness is a root evil. It is the progenitor of a multitude of sins. It is the drag-net of vices without number. "What will you give me?" "What is there in it for me?" "How

"My little children, guard yourselves from idols." - 1 John 5:21.
POINTED SUGGESTIONS
By Rev. D. W. Snider.

Between the pure, unadorned heights of God and the depths of the abyssal degradation of a heathen orgy there is room for vivid contrasts and the play of forces which are forever antagonistic and irreconcilable. The lesson pictures to us with full dramatic power the intense situation when such antagonisms meet.

An interesting and instructive study of character is afforded in the conduct of Moses and Aaron - Moses, when coming from the heights of supreme privilege and leadership, and Aaron, when troubled and provokingly pressed by the wishes and whims of a multitude who are childish in their fickleness, stubborn in their complaints and without faith or gratitude or vision.

It is not wise to credit Moses with every virtue of nobility or religion nor to charge Aaron with an utter lack of any of them. So-called righteous anger may exceed, as with Moses, and religious leadership may grievously fail, as with Aaron. Let it be understood that neither of them measured to the Christ-like.

Opinion may differ as to the grandeur of the wrath of Moses when he became aware of the idolatrous feasting of the people, but this one thing is certain, that if the same spirit took possession of righteous men today against iniquitous practices, such as drunkenness, licentiousness, industrial slavery, etc., the original "gold cure" of Moses would find speedy and effective counterpart in wiping out the scenes, and traffic and opportunities of such vicious deeds and doings from the face of the earth.

Let not this more worthy lesson, however, be forgotten: the second thoughts of Moses were better than his first, while the deeds of his first impulses left his hands empty of the sacred things committed to them. His second thought - his overnight reflections - took him back to God and to the spirit of mighty intercession. There is where Moses is seen at his best.

The pitiful exhibit which Aaron while yielding to the irritating weakness of the people and their clamor for someone to take the place of their absentee leader is repeated by the church when it stoops to cater to the so-called needs and cries of the times. Carnal methods can never build a spiritual church. But for the suggestion of any worldling as to how to run a church there is found some preacher as its advocate.

And sinners are always great scientists in the handling of old junk. Wonderful designs come from its recasting like the calf from the gold of the realists. But as the Israelites sinned in laying down their gold to worship what came out of it, so sinners today cannot fashion their gods by any transformation of their wealth without sin. Jehovah is unmakeable and unpurchasable.

Moreover, He judges righteously, and the interceding Moses cannot die for another's sin. He is better fitted for leadership by the spirit of self-surrendering love which has entered his soul, and to that duty God sent him. Likewise, the track of one's business is better discerned from the place of prayer than from the place of its stifling activities. "Thy book" - "My book," meaning God's Book. These are solemn assertions of record which the lesson makes. No one can give himself more careful or prayerful thinking than to the most earnest inquiry as to his relation to the record.
