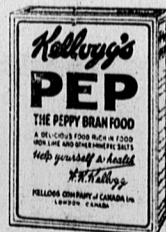

THE REVISED RATE FOLLOWING IS EFFECTIVE FROM DATE OF LAST METER READING AND WILL APPLY TO BILLS FOR MONTH OF JUNE, 1927.

POWER RATE

Applicable to consumers who can be served from suitable existing lines. No bill rendered on this rate of less than \$3.00 per month.

Service Charges:

On all connected load a Service Charge of 50 cents per month per Horse Power, will be made for the first 10 H. P. of connected load. When connected load exceeds 10 Horse Power that part of such load in excess of 10 Horse Power, will carry no Service Charge.

Energy Charge—(In addition to Service Charge.)

For the first 200 k. w. h. per month at 7c per k. w. h.
For the next 300 k. w. h. per month at 5c per k. w. h.
For the next 500 k. w. h. per month at 4c per k. w. h.
Excess of 1000 k. w. h. per month at 3c per k. w. h.
Discount—None.

Minimum Charge—(Effective for connected loads in excess of 10 H. P.)

In case the bill for any month computed on the service charge plus the energy rate is less than 50 cents per Horse Power of all connected load, then a Minimum Bill computed at 50 cents per Horse Power on all connected load, will be rendered.

Waiving of Minimum Charge:

The Minimum Charge will be waived for any three, consecutive months in a year, upon the Company receiving written notice from the Consumer requesting that Minimum Charge be waived for three specified consecutive months.

Note—In case a Consumer desires service for intermittent use of small motors and such service would result in a monthly bill of less than \$3.00 computed at power rate, then such consumer may elect to be billed on the Lighting Rate, carrying a Service Charge of 50 cents per Horse Power of connected load.

Another Place for Oil

Rumble seats, appearing in constantly increasing number on roadsters and coupes, have provided a new opportunity for the oil can. To facilitate raising and lowering these seats, it is imperatively necessary to keep the hinges well lubricated. This is particularly true on those cars with rumble seats that are operated from the front compartment. More than ordinary care is required in this work for oil carelessly used will wreak heavy damage to the clothing of the next person to use the seat.

Crossing the Boulevard

To get across the boulevard during the hour of heavy travel frequently is a difficult driving feat. Since traffic on the more important thoroughfare has the right way at all times, considerable speed is necessary if one is to cross without disrupting the main traffic stream. It may be helpful in this predicament to remember that the average car will pick up faster in second gear. Shift to high after crossing.

Tip on New Car Buying

It does not pay to accept a rumor about the car one is contemplating buying. If the car is reported to have a weakness that can be shown up in a demonstration, give the salesman a chance to prove the report to be wrong. If, for instance, the car is said to lack power, see to it that a convincing demonstration on this point is made. Frequently the acceptance of a rumor as fact keeps one from buying the car one really preferred.

Silencing Rod Whistle

Spark and gas control rods will set up a whistling noise if they are sufficiently loose to start vibrating. It occasionally happens that even when tightened they will continue to make such a noise, particularly those placed on the instrument board. A very light oil is the most effective remedy for this car malady. A heavy oil will not penetrate.

Watch oiled highways

Highway oiling is at hand in many sections of the country. This type of road surface presents an especial hazard to the motorist and requires great care in driving of one is to avoid a dangerous skid. Front-wheel skidding, the most dangerous variety, is more common on the oiled highway than on any other and it is responsible for many of the serious accidents that occur on such roads. One should proceed as slow speeds on an oiled road, especially at turns and curves.

Eliminate Light Flicker

In some ways, the headlight that flickers is worse than no light at all. A flickering headlight is unnecessary. Usually the remedy is a matter of making the connection at the lamp tight. It requires but a few minutes work and the reward fully justifies the time and energy spent on the task.

Alternate the car tires

When high-pressure cord tires were in general use, the motor car owner made it a practice to change them from wheel to wheel in order to get the utmost wear out of them. Since the balloon tires came into prominence, it is found that this practice has been more or less discontinued. Tire experts, however, have found the old system still to be helpful, and advocate its resumption. In this connection, it is well to remember that the rear tires get the greatest wear and in making a change it is best to move them forward instead of from one back wheel to the other.
