LOVESICK BOY TRIES SUICIDE

NEW YORK, Dec. 4. (Special)—Seventeen-year-old Carl Lloyd, who last evening was found unconscious in a room where three gas jets were turned on was today able to leave the Jewish Hospital and was taken to the Flatbush magistrate's court, where he was arraigned on a charge of having attempted suicide. The case was put off for a week. The boy's life was saved through a note which he had attempted to send through a chum, George Dermody, 15 years old, to Miss Florence Malone, "I am ending it all tonight, Carl," read the note, and instead of taking it to the girl, the Dermody boy ran with it to the Grand avenue police station, where he showed it to Lieutenant Powers. The police officer sent Patrolman Boehm to look up the boy.

In a room where the Lloyd boy had been boarding for a short while, the policeman found him on the floor, with gas flowing from three jets. The officer opened the windows, and worked over him until the arrival of Dr. Gray of the Jewish Hospital. The boy had worked as a clerk, and about two weeks ago he had gone to live with the Tisdales, after a dispute with his own family over the Malone girl. He had said he wanted to marry her, but the parents objected on the ground that he was too young. The note was scribbled on a street, and to George Dermody the Lloyd boy had said that delivering the note to Miss Malone would be the last service he would ask of him in this world.
