Receipts: cattle 204; calves 183; hogs 764; sheep and lambs 100. Good weaners made \$9.25 to \$9.50, mediums \$9 and commons down to \$8. Grassers brought from \$3.25 to \$4. Good ewes and wethers traded from \$7.75 to \$8. Weighty lambs were cut \$1 and culs and bucks \$2 per hundredweight. Sheep made \$2 to \$3.50. Hogs made \$9.25 for bacon fed and \$8.25 for select drawing the usual \$1 per hog premium. Butchers and heavies went at \$8.75 and extra heavies and light hogs at \$8.25. Sows made \$6.50 to \$7 with an odd one at \$7.50.

MINING

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) TORONTO, Oct. 12 — Nervous selling widened the current decline in the Toronto Stock Market today, sending the Miscellaneous Mines to within 28 of the year's low, off more than three points for the day. A two point decline was registered by the gold share index. A considerable list of the junior and secondary golds slipped off while selling quieted actively but there was a minor rally in the last 15 minutes. Hudson Bay and Noranda declined 1-2 to 1-5-8 while the cheaper base metals were slightly less depressed. Sheritt, Pend Oreille, Aldermac and Chromium dropped 1-2 to 6 cents each. Ventures, Falconbridge and subduary Basin slid 25 to 50 cents and Waite-Amulet 10. Eldorado was sold for a 10 cent advance. Losses of 10 to 25 cents among the medium-price golds were cut to about half in the last hour-hour. Anglo-Huronian and Read-Author were down 25 cents each at the close. Wright Hargreaves slipped 25 cents and fractions. Losses were boarded for Hollinger, Lake Shore and McIntyre and Dome was off a point. In the western oils, Royalite had a decline of 3-4 to 33 and Home, Calgary-Edmonton, Davies, Pete, Dalhousie and Monarch slipped cents. Texas-Canadian dropped 15 cents and Homestead 3.
