 GLOUCESTER, Mass., Oct 7—An unofficial brush between the schooners Gertrude L. Thebaud, challenger for the International fishermen's trophy and the Elsie yesterday furnished Gloucester with an unexpected thrill. The Thebaud will meet the Elsie Thursday in the opening of a series of three races, prior to her departure next Monday for Halifax to meet Bluenose of Lunenburg, N.S., present holder of the blue ribbon of the North Atlantic fishing fleets.

Yesterdays brush came as Captain Ben Pine had Thebaud outside for sail stretching and tuning up. Elsie was sighted emerging from a bank of fog off Norman's Woe. Captain Ben said he'd run down and say "hello" but as the antagonists drew together his purpose was lost sight of. Crews of both schooners, already imbued with the spirit of rivalry, hastened to trim sails and soon both vessels were bowling along with the water chortling in the lee scuppers.

The wind was fickle and soon one schooner had the advantage and then the other. At the approach of nightfall, the wind had again fallen to scarcely furnish steersage way and it would be difficult to say which schooner could claim the best position.
