Captain Bernier, whose ambition it is that a Canadian shall discover the north pole, seeing that the mysterious axis of the globe is in Dominion territory, has some \$30,000 already subscribed toward his projected expedition. He has now set off for England where he hopes to get \$40,000 more. He will then apply to the Canadian Parliament for a grant and if he gets it will then fit out his ship and then we shall see what we shall see.

We find an instance copied from The London Globe, of the great-hearted sympathy of the British Tommy Atkins with the relatives of a comrade. Here is the simple story, which tells its own tale: "The kit of a trooper in the South African Constabulary, whose death left his widowed mother entirely unsupported, has been sold among his comrades for ninety times its value. Among other items, two half penny match boxes went for £2 3s. Truly the men are splendid."

It appears that the plot to revolutionise the Klondyke originated with two American gamblers. They formed the secret Order of the Midnight Sun and levied on the members \$15 a head. The money was raised ostensibly to aid the Boers, a sufficient test of the anti-British sentiment of all who would join. The real object of the conspirators seems to have been to raise a force strong enough to plunder the banks and seize the gold. One of the members peached, and then the police were prepared for the emergency.

According to the Director of the United States Mint the world's output of gold in the year 1900 was \$257,514,700 being 49 millions of dollars less than the preceding year on account of the Boer war. The principal gains were \$8,118,000 in the United States and \$6,806,000 in Canada. The United States leads the list of gold producing countries as it also leads in all countries in the production of silver. And silver has advanced in price four cents during the year, being now quoted at 86.3 cents per ounce.

Until about thirty years ago Canadian banks were permitted to issue notes to the amount of their paid up capital with the amount of specie and legal tender in their possession added. At the instance of the bankers the right of circulation was thereafter limited to the amount of paid up capital. In the present period of expansion many of the banks have now in circulation almost if not quite the full amount of notes they can legally issue. It is now claimed that as the redemption of notes is guaranteed practically by all the banks there is no need for the limitation in regard to circulation as imposed thirty years ago.

The wording of the advertisement referred to made the meaning quite plain. I do not see it more improper for an auctioneer to call a fine bred and registered Shorthorn cow "Standard Bred" than for well trained and well educated Agricultural Editors and writers calling all sorts of fine bred domestic animals and birds thoroughbred, as is the almost universal practice all over America. Those writers appearing to be ignorant of the fact that "Thoroughbred" is the proper name of the British race horse breed, and that it is quite improper to speak of a thoroughbred sheep, cow or cart-horse as to call them "Standard Bred" which is the proper name of the trotting bred horse.
