Say Roumania Lacks Ammunition

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
BERLIN, Aug. 29.—The Roumanian minister leaves the city to-day. He requested a special interview with the Imperial Chancellor, Dr. Von Bethmann-Holweg last night but it was promptly refused.

Despatches from Vienna indicate that Roumania's war declaration caused no particular excitement, but resulted almost everywhere in a sigh of relief that the worst now is known.

Bulgaria undoubtedly will follow the lead of Germany in declaring war on Roumania, in the opinion of Count Ernest Von Reventlow, the naval expert of the Tages Zeitung. Commenting on the action of Roumania, Von Reventlow writes:—

"It may be assumed with certainty, that Germany and her allies had counted upon Roumania as participating in the war and have taken measures in advance.

"In view of the geographical situation, the presumption is permissible that military developments are imminent. It was certain that the German empire would regard the cause of its Austro-Hungarian ally as its own. And Bulgaria undoubtedly will do the same. The allies will meet the new enemy, who once was befriended by the Central Powers, with whom he even had a treaty alliance, and who, after two years of purposeful waiting and deception, now enters the camp of our enemies, and draws sword for the simple reason that he believes the moment has come to take booty."

The Vossische Zeitung asserts that "the meddling of Roumania in the war means for Bulgaria a new military and political objective."

KILLED AS HE EATS LUNCHEON

BOSTON, Mass., Aug. 31.—In the presence of 20 frightened guests and employees, Charles W. Cranney, one of Boston's best known head waiters, was shot to death while directing the serving of food in the second floor dining room of the Hotel Essex at 2.30 on Monday afternoon.

His assassin entered quietly, fired five shots, coolly reloaded his pistol and disappeared by a rear stairway. The police say he was a discharged employee, named Stell Zackareke. They quickly sent a general alarm to all outlying police.

The shots resounded through the hotel and a rush was made for the second floor. The house and neighborhood were hurriedly searched, but the murderer had disappeared.

Zackareke had been discharged from this dining room twice in a fortnight. The last time was yesterday noon, after he had persistently disobeyed orders, until the hotel management suggested his dismissal. The men were old-time friends and belonged to the Walters Benevolent Association, of which Cranney had been financial secretary for 10 years.

Zackareke was known to be quarrelsome, according to the police. It

Charles W. Cranney had been head waiter at the Essex for 15 years. He was one of the most trusted officers of the waiters' organization. At the age of 47 he was married, two weeks ago, to Miss Mary Doyle, of Beachmont. They opened a pretty home at 41 Alexander avenue, Medford. They motored to visit relatives in Clinton the day before the shooting.

Cranney had been warned against Zackareke. Not long ago flowers were put in his letter box, with a note asking him to make selection for his funeral. He passed this over as a joke.

Roumanians And Hungarians Clash

(Canadian Press Despatch.)
LONDON, Aug. 29.—Desperate fighting on the border between Roumania and Hungary is reported in an Exchange Telegraph despatch from Bern, Switzerland. The Roumanians, the message says, are making various efforts to capture the important mountain passes.

The economic advantages which could be gained by over-running Roumania rapidly, are not overlooked. In the event of swift and successful invasion, Roumania's vast stores of grain and rich oil wells, would be accessible to the Central Powers, which would be most welcome.

The indications are that the difficult nature of the ground along the banks of the Danube and on the Hungarian mountain border will localize the first clashes. The general strategic situation makes it possible for the troops of the central powers to assume the defensive with thin lines, leaving larger masses free to attempt invasion at the selected points. It is believed here that Roumania's action was precipitated by the Bulgarian offensive.
