SHOE DEALERS
MEET IN MONCTON

MONCTON, N. B., Aug. 17.—Members of the Maritime Wholesale Shoe Association are gathering here to attend their semi-annual meeting this afternoon. One of the questions to come before the meeting will be the proposed organization of a national wholesale shoe organization.

S. Roy Weaver, Toronto, manager of the Shoe Manufacturers' Association of Canada, will attend the convention and speak on the possibilities of association work. Mr. Weaver, who arrived in Moncton last night, expressed the opinion that there would be a serious shortage of boots and shoes for the fall and winter trade. He said:

"There can be no question but that business conditions, so far as the shoe manufacturing industry is concerned, are much improved. Many of the companies are operating at capacity, and, for the industry as a whole, orders are

very much larger than was the case at this time a year ago." "No one can pretend that business readjustments are yet complete, but business people are coming to realize that such readjustment process is not a matter of merely a few weeks or a few months. The prices of footwear are now from 30 to 45 per cent lower than was the case in the spring of 1920 and no further reduction can be made in the prices of boots and shoes except as perhaps costs of production may slowly work a little lower. On the other hand the prices of the better grades of leather recently have been firm and even tending upwards and merchants may safely order boots and shoes for current requirements with the utmost confidence in an immediate substantial reduction in prices can be made."

Green Corn Fritters

For the corn fritters grate eight ears of fresh corn and add to the grated corn half a cup of finely chopped green pepper, a well beaten egg and a seasoning of salt. Drop by spoonfuls into hot butter and turn same as hot cakes.

Imperial Deviled Crab

Crabs are at their best here and all cafters serve them. One of the most popular crab dishes is called Imperial Deviled Crab and is made by removing the meat from the body and claws of a large hard crab after steaming. Make a sauce by blending four tablespoons of butter with one tablespoon of flour and one cup of rich milk, when well mixed place on the fire and stir constantly until thick and smooth, now add one well beaten egg, mixed with a little cold water, one teaspoon of mustard, half a cup of finely chopped fried onion, a seasoning of salt and nutmeg. Mix the sauce with the crab flakes and add half a cup of fine bread crumbs. Place the shell, dot with butter, sprinkle with chopped parsley and brown in the oven.

Another tasty crab dish is called Crab Ravigote. This is made by mixing one finely chopped green pepper, one finely chopped fresh pimiento, two chopped tomatoes, and one tablespoon of chopped parsley with two cups of fresh cooked crab meat. Add half a cup of lemon mayonnaise dressing and a seasoning of salt and paprika. Place in cleaned crab shells or scallop shells and garnish with lemon and pickle slices. A very tasty addition to this dish can be made by laying on top of each shell two fillets of anchovies.

Crab Flake Cocktails

These are served in the best places by placing a small deep dish, like a dessert dish, in a large dish filled with cracked ice in the centre of the small dish place a small glass filled with a good oyster cocktail and heap up around the glass cold cooked crab flakes.
