According to the purpose of Him who prayed, "That they all may be one, as Thou Father art in me, and I in Thee, that they all may be one in us." Whatever added advantage of religious training and discipline is provided by the Church for its members, and whatever advantage is secured, through that training, the supreme advantage is and remains the realization of the spirit and hope of unity, ever widening in its scope, ever deep-

ening in its purpose. And the accomplishment of this purpose is not simply left to us to develop of ourselves. To its accomplishment God's gracious spirit is given, and He stands ready today to work as mightily a miracle in and through the Church as He did on the Day of Pentecost.  
Second.—There is another thing involved in church membership, as suggested by the text, and that is spiritual unity for the purpose of spiritual achievement. There is more in the words, "Give me thy hand," than the outward sign of spiritual union. These words, as you recall, were the words of Jehu, King of Israel. And our only justification for their use, so far as Jehu is concerned, is that Jehu was occupied with the work of God. It was rather a business to be called the work of God. I'll admit, but such Jehu evidently believed it to be. The slaughter of men and of whole fam-

ilies! The royal household! They do not appear to have had much trouble in those days reaching the man "higher up" when there were wrongs to be righted. When Israel needed to be purged of iniquity and idolatry, the royal blood was the first to flow. But the point to be remembered is that when Jehu reached out his hand that day to take the hand of Jehonadab, it meant business for them both, even the business of God. My friends, the obligation to join the church rests upon the most practical foundation. Why do men join together to form armies? Because there is fighting to do, and the larger the army, all things considered, the more certain is the victory. Why do men combine in business? Because the resources of many are greater than the resources of one and make possible larger business enterprises. Why do men form political parties? Because the policy of one is more likely to be carried into effect if the one be-

comes a thousand. The logic is simple enough. "In union there is strength." Now, this simple axiom of everyday life God has neither disregarded nor disregarded in the formation of His church. But let me ask you one or two questions. First, how many men in Brooklyn tonight do you suppose are fully alive to the fact that God has a work to do in this world in which we are all invited to be co-laborers with Him? Second, if we would be laborers together with God, what is the first simple step to take in order to make our work most effective? Is it to draw away or keep away from those who are seeking to co-operate with one another and with God? Is it not rather to stand shoulder to shoulder and heart to heart? To join hand with hand and gift with gift and prayer with prayer, to the end that God's will may be done on earth as it is in heaven?  
The story of the church, my friends,

is its work. It is not even its history or its theology or its liturgy, but the work that has been given us to do in the name of God. If you would see the church's chief, its compelling feature of attraction, look out into its broad field of labor. The salvation of the world from sin and wrong, that's our task. Is there anything that can be compared to it? Oh, that we who already belong to the church might see, as we ought to see, the magnitude of our task, the grandeur of it, its infinite worth! Let us not think of the church simply as a place where we may receive things—attentions, distinctions, candy at Christmas. Let us think of the church as the place where a great work is to be done, in the accomplishment of which we may have a share. The very greatness of that work calls loudly not alone for the help of God, but for the co-operation of all good men.
