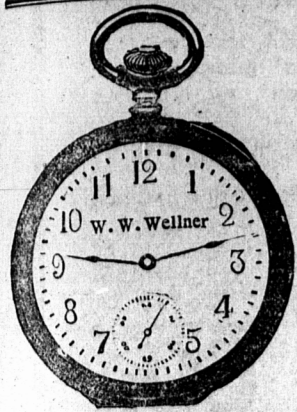

J. BOYLE & Sons, Fredericton, killed a hog recently of their own raising which dressed 676 pounds. It was undoubtedly the record hog of the season for that locality. The animal was eighteen months old, and during the past few months has been fed only once a day.—Fredericton, N. B., Ex.

GEO. E. KARL, Quebec, was in the city last night on route from P. E. Island, where he purchased 23 big horses for the lumber woods. Mr. Karl says "It costs money to trade with the P. E. Island horse dealers now. The Island farmers are devoting more attention than ever before to raising good stock, and they intend to make purchasers pay for the horses they buy in that province. I bought the horses in different parts of the Island from farmers. It is no use to try to "dicker" with a horse trader for it would cost you more than to go direct to the farmer. I got some fine horses, and shipped them by a schooner, and made the freight cheap."—Moncton Times.

AN issue of the Colonial Herald of 1841 contains the following interesting item of pigeon flights:—The Brussels papers mention the following pigeon flights as having just taken place. On Sunday morning Aug. 21st at ten o'clock 80 young pigeons from Brussels were let off at Paris; the first of which reached home at two minutes past two the same afternoon, and eight others within seven minutes after, many more reaching home during the day. The same morning 147 young pigeons from Antwerp were let off at London between eight and nine. The first arrived at Antwerp at five minutes past two the same afternoon, five others before half past two, 16 more before four and 12 more before the evening.
