Annual Meeting Of P. E. I. Poultry Association

The annual meeting of the P. E. I. Poultry Association was held in Charlottetown, on the 1st day of March, 1932.

All the Charlottetown members were present, but on account of the state of the roads we had no representative from the rural districts. The president, Mr. W. J. Cudmore in his report, spoke of the successful year completed, and of the most successful poultry show ever held by our association.

He thanked each and every member for their loyal support and hearty cooperation, their combined efforts having made it a successful year, also expressed his gratitude to the public spirited citizens who by their donations and attendance also helped toward its success.

The Secretary read the financial statement, giving a detailed account of debit and credit, showing a slight balance on the credit side.

Three new members were welcomed at the meeting.

The Secty. was presented with a purse, as a token of appreciation for his services, which he willingly gave, expecting no remuneration.

Mr. Driscoll read an article written in the Family Herald and Weekly Star, Feb. 17th, issue, on the advisability of using commercial feeds for small flocks of poultry. The part of this article stressed was in reference to the great development in the poultry industry. Whereby the life of the chick from the day it is first hatched to the day of its disposal is reared artificially, and forced to develop very quickly, to either be a heavy egg producer or used as market poultry.

In order to get the greatest results, experts on poultry and poultry feeds, have found that certain grains and other feeds, which contain protein and have a vitamin content are necessary to produce a healthy chick, one that can stand up to the strain of heavy laying. To the ordinary person who has a small flock of poultry, some of the ingredients of a proper ration are hard to get or expensive in small quantities and again are difficult to mix in the correct proportions.

The commercial feed houses today have experts studying the wants of the hen, and procuring their feeds in large quantities at a cheap rate, with modern machinery, the mash is thoroughly mixed and in the right quantity and proportion, so that the feed consumed by the chick or hen will give the greatest results to the bodily wants of the hen, such as growth, and egg production with the least energy and detriment to the internal organs.

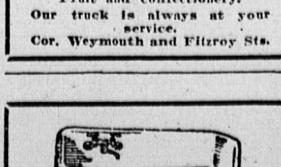
