#### HOW WOULD ONTARIO LIKE IT?

If Ontario, for instance, had lost one third of her original representation of 83 in a House of 181 members, believing that by the terms of the Union she was guaranteed to her for all time, and were brought down to 55 in a House of 214, how would the Ontario people like it?

And if Ontario was in the immediate prospect of further loss after next census that would bring her representation down to one half the original number, or to 41 in a House of 238, how would her people view the situation?

And if, moreover these losses of representation were believed by the Ontario people to be directly due to the Federal Government having for all the years since Confederation refused to carry out the principal stipulation of the Union Terms by which that Province was induced to enter the federation, what would her people say?

And yet these are but in part the conditions actually existing in Prince Edward Island today proportionally applied to Ontario.

To extend the parallel a little further: Suppose that Ontario were wholly shut off from telegraph connection with the rest of the world for two weeks in January and February of this year, and nothing done by the Government for four weeks of that time to restore it:

Suppose further that not a passenger, a pound of freight or a bag of mail from the other Provinces or the outside world could reach Toronto except by way of Hamilton:

Suppose moreover that for days at a time during this present winter not a single male passenger could enter or leave the Province of Ontario at all except by assisting to drag a boat over ice hammocks and through slush and water for nine miles and pay two dollars for the privilege, if he lived through it—a woman paying four dollars for the nine miles but excused from pulling.

And yet these conditions would only be the duplication in Ontario of conditions actually existing here. What would the people of Ontario think and say and do if they were subjected to such conditions by the bad faith of the Government at Ottawa?

Furthermore, suppose that for every pound of freight and every passenger carried by rail and steamer from Ontario to the nearest Province east and west, the rates of passage or freight for the transportation were double what they are in other Provinces. And yet if Ontario were thus treated in all these particulars she would be treated precisely as Prince Edward Island is treated.

We invite our Ontario contemporaries to reproduce this article if they dare, and to refute a single sentence in it if they can.

And if they dare not print it, knowing that it cannot be refuted or answered, we ask them to cease wondering why The Guardian says our relations with Canada must be mended or ended.

#### WHY IS THIS?

We are informed that Samuel Gay, long since convicted of violating the Prohibitory Law, is still at large with his fine unpaid. Why is this? It is the second time of asking and receiving no answer. Why should it be necessary to call attention to such matters in the public press? The public pay roundly for the administration of justice and have a right to expect that it will be administered without delay and with an even hand. When justice ceases to be even handed it ceases to be justice. When those charged with the administration of justice help to defeat the law and the ends of justice by their action or inaction they themselves become law breakers of the most pernicious kind. There are other cases besides that of Gay, but that is a sample of them all. We sincerely hope it may not become necessary to speak more plainly, but we are quite prepared to do so if the emergency calls for it.

#### MR. HYMAN'S RETURN.

It has been given out in Parliament by Sir Wilfrid Laurier that Hon. C. S. Hyman, Minister of Public Works, is now regaining his health, has definitely re-

signed his seat for London and will probably seek re-election there and that in the meantime he will remain a member of the Cabinet and the official head of the Works Department. Mr. Hyman is personally one of the more popular members of the Government. He denies that he was in any way implicated in the London election scandal. Of that fact the electors of his constituency ought to be the best judges. Should they again accord him their confidence as we expect they will, his return to the Cabinet and Parliament will not be unacceptable to the country at large. His action in resigning his seat, when not compelled by the caucus to do so, has gone far to rehabilitate him in public favor.

#### OUR LOST REPRESENTATION.

The Patriot takes exception to our statement that "the Island has lost one third of its representation under the present Liberal regime," and we accept the correction. Our object has never been to fix the responsibility for our losses of population, representation and in business upon one party or the other, or upon one more than the other. We care nothing for party. The facts are these:

Prince Edward Island was represented by six members in the Commons down to the close of the session, April 23, 1896. Sir Wilfrid Laurier did not become Premier till July 11 following. The loss therefore actually occurred some short time before the Liberal party came in power, and what was more important, the cause which produced that loss had been operating under the Conservative regime for years before.

The idea we had in mind was that down to 1896 we had six members in the Commons, since which date we have lost two. Let the parties apportion the blame between them in any way they choose.
