Navy Reveals Sinking Of German Submarine

OTTAWA, May 31 (CP) - The Navy announced today the sinking of a German submarine and the capture of an unstarred number of prisoners in the North Atlantic recently in an attack by six warships, including four Canadian vessels... The U-boat, sinking on the flank of a big convoy, was detected by a frigate when one of the Canadian warships, the destroyer Galt, was forced to leave the convoy because of a distiller defect and immediately spotted the raider... The attack was opposed by another destroyer, two corvettes and a frigate of the Canadian Navy... The submarine was forced to the surface, where it was destroyed... The commander of the submarine was killed in the action... The Galt was commanded by Lt.-Cmdr. H. V. W. Oros of Victoria... The other Canadian ships were the destroyer Chaudre, Lt.-Cmdr. Pat Nixon of Victoria... the corvette Chilliwick, Lt.-Cmdr. Clifton R. (Tony) Coughlin of Ottawa, and P. Fenel, Lt. Cmdr. William P. Moffatt of Montreal, and the frigate St. Catharines, Lt.-Cmdr. War Situation Last Night

Even without a Berlin admission that the battle for Rome is near its crisis there is much to suggest that the hour for Russian and Allied attacks on other fronts keyed in with that first major blow of the summer campaign in Europe is about to start... Moscow has reported a limited German offensive in the last night of Rome which dented the Russian front. It is probable main jump-off spot for the impending red army offensive aimed at the Galati gap gateway to the Danube Valley at Bucharest and at Ploesti. The Nazi attack apparently is a German attempt to disrupt the expected Russian drive and sap its force... In Italy, there are indications that the Allied march on Rome is nearing the point set for supply or for escape if they fail to halt the Russian armies when they strike... Most military observers, however, believe the main Russian contribution to the summer campaign will not fall in Romania but in Poland. It is there, north of the Carpathians and south of the marshes of the Pripiat, that probably the heaviest concentration of Russian power is nearing completion. That is the eventual Russian road to Berlin.

HALIFAX, May 31 (CP) - Establishment of a commission to study the problems of youth in the Nova Scotia Diocese of the Church of England (Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island) was decided on today at the Diocesan synod of the church... The resolution carried with it a proposal for a youth center and the establishment of a youth center of the Church of England, which would serve for synod purposes as well as a leadership school, boys' camp, girls' camp, conference center and a social and spiritual center... Rev. L. W. Mosher, synod and A. Y. P. A. representative on the Board of Religious Education, said there was a paramount need for work among youth, indicating that other bodies were far in advance and the Diocese of Nova Scotia was behind other dioceses.

Search For Oil Is High On Survey List

OTTAWA, May 31 (CP) - Survey parties of the mines and geology branch of the department will concentrate this year on search for new sources of petroleum base metals and strategic metals, the department announced tonight... The 1944 field program provides for 22 survey parties to engage in geological mapping and investigation and 14 in topographical mapping... Four of the geological parties will operate in the Northwest Territories, seven in British Columbia, six in Alberta, one in Saskatchewan, two in Manitoba, two in Ontario, four in Quebec, two in New Brunswick and two in Nova Scotia... In addition, one party will examine the area adjacent to the canal pipeline road in Yukon and the Northwest Territories and another will collect minerals in Ontario and Quebec to replenish the supply used in preparing mineral sets for prospectors... Three of the topographical parties will work in the Yukon and adjoining portions of northern British Columbia, three in the Northwest Territories, three in Alberta, one in Manitoba, one in New Brunswick, two in Nova Scotia and one in Prince Edward Island.

New Quarters For U. S. Consulate

SAINT JOHN, N. De Valera Wins Clear Majority In Election

DUBLIN, June 1 (Thursday) (CP) - With two-thirds of the votes counted, candidates of the Fianna Fail Party headed by Premier Eamon De Valera were winning almost three-to-one ahead of all other candidates... The Prime Minister called the election three weeks ago after defeat of a government-sponsored transport bill headed the poll in 14,200 votes, 761 less than he received last year... In addition to De Valera, these ministers were re-elected: Vice-Premier Sean T. O'Kelly; Tomas Derrig education; Oscar Traynor, defence; Sean Lemass, commerce; Frank A. Ryan, minister for co-ordination of defensive measures; Gerard Boland, Justice.

Consignment Of Mails Reported Lost

OTTAWA, May 31 (CP) - Postmaster General Mulock announced today the loss through courier action of a consignment of mails for members of the Canadian army forces in the United Kingdom... The mails, including parcels and tobacco gifts, were dispatched from the base post office in Canada between April 10 and 12.

Jap Railway In Burma Attacked

KANDY, Ceylon, May 31 (AP) - The railway feeding Japan's beleaguered Burma base is under intense aerial attack which may have blocked the flow of supplies over that vital line... As the Japanese yielded slowly under heavy Allied pressure on the by-passed Mawlaikheung to the southeast, and on Myittha, a spokesman said it was inconceivable that the enemy could bring anything up the railroad from Mandalay for these three strongholds... While there are roads and trails the Japanese use, the loss of this avenue would "most effectively" stem the northward movement of reinforcements, he said.

British Units 14 Miles From Eternal City

NAPLES, May 31 (CP) - Allied troops smashed closer to Rome today at the west end of the long Allied line across Italy, thrust into the outskirts of the important town of Frosinone 45 miles southwest of the capital and drove forward in the upper Liri Valley and in mountainous central Italy... British troops of the 5th army crossed the Mofetta river all along their sector nearest the Tyrrhenian Sea and captured four villages in a thrust against the Italian capital from the south... The heaviest fighting was in the 26-mile stretch of front from the outskirts of Valmontone, 20 miles east and somewhat south of Rome through the fringes of the Alban Hills to the Tyrrhenian Sea... The German radio said fierce "street fighting" was raging in the town of Valmontone, 20 miles east and somewhat south of Rome where that highland winds across the slopes of the Alban Hills... Other British and American 5th army forces who advanced through deadly fire and repulsed savage counter-attacks west of Valmontone were reported to have reached a point within six miles of the Pope's summer home at Castel Gandolfo and within approximately 16 miles of Rome... All four key strongpoints on the line - Valmontone, the Lariano, Lanivio and Campomonte - have been under fierce assault for several days and fast are being turned into smoking ruins by massed Allied artillery.

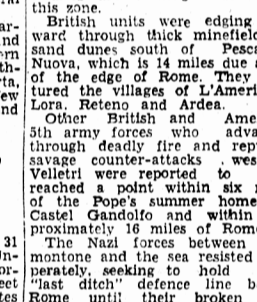
