On July 10, 1943, one day previous to the Sicily invasion, she landed in Sicily in North Africa. The hospital was located at a malaria-infested area, but efficient was the medical preventive methods, not one nurse contracted the disease.

Back To England

On June 5, 1944, she was back in England to transfer to the 12th Canadian General Hospital. She spent several weeks in Yorkling in special training and on August 1st located at France. The hospital was free to all members of the armed forces and other Allied troops had done for them.
