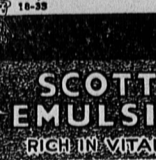
Virginia rose in a flurry completed her toilette as rapidly as possible, and pretty soon might have been seen heading across the fields toward Green Gables.

Less Borrowings And More Deposits In Chartered Banks

OTTAWA, Oct. 11—(O.P.)—The chartered banks of Canada had more deposits and less loans out in the Dominion on Aug. 31, than on the corresponding date a year ago. This was revealed in the bank statement just issued by the Department of Finance.

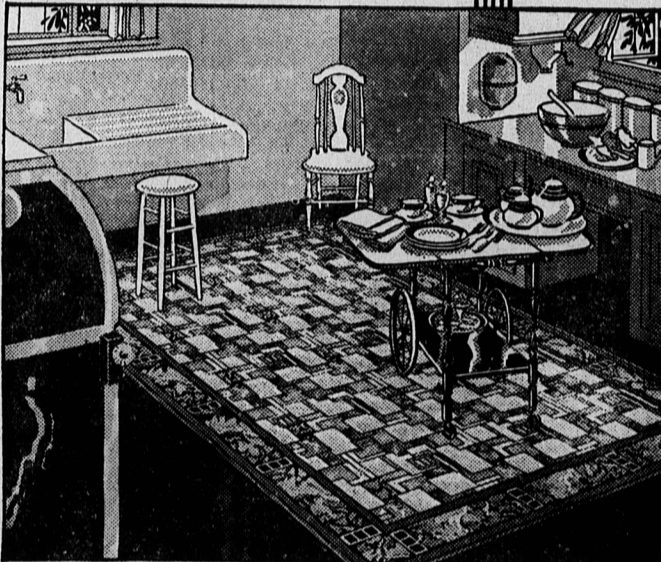
As a rule loan increases are reflected in deposit increases since much of the money provided by the loans finds its way into deposits somewhere. However at the end of August, call loans in Canada were down \$9,036,790 and the current loans \$119,246,508 or altogether \$128,283,298 as compared with a year ago. The increase of \$6,533,674 in current or demand deposits and \$6,066,935 in savings deposits over last year, or a total of \$14,600,609 is therefore regarded as all the more significant.

While the figures would seem to indicate that the people of Canada are strengthening their bank accounts by borrowing less and depositing more, the end-of-August returns are not regarded as reflecting any considerable expansion of business.
