LONDON, June 16—As a final to the preparations for the Pan-Anglican Congress, which opened in London Monday, two days last week were taken up with a series of meetings of women. The chief of these gatherings was presided over by Mrs. Davidson, wife of the Archbishop of Canterbury, at which the delegates contributed reports of their special work. Both the Prince of Wales and Lord Strathcona are to give garden parties next week in honor of the delegates. Two hundred Bishops and Archdeacons of the Anglican denomination, including about forty American Bishops, have arrived here to take part in the Congress. On Monday evening they will be entertained at a grand banquet by the Pilgrims' Society.
