WEALTHY PARISH PAYS TAX ON \$15,171,024

NEW YORK, May 8.—The parish of Trinity Church, often described as the wealthiest in the world, is now paying taxes on property valued at \$15,171,024, an increase of nearly half a million during the year, according to figures given in a 500-page year book covering the activities of Trinity Church and the nine chapels of the parish. It is said to be the most voluminous year book ever printed by a church. Reports show that the church corporation now owns 366 houses, in which between 3,000 and 4,000 persons are living.
