The City of Ghent arrived in port yesterday afternoon and sailed during the evening with a large cargo.

The schooner Aurora, Roseneath, loaded coal at Sydney on Thursday for A. Pickard & Co. and is now due in this port.

The schooner Helen C. Moore arrived in Dartmouth, N. S., last Friday from Charlottetown with 2,000 bushels of potatoes.

Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Kelly, of River, side, N. B., formerly of this city, entertained the teachers of the Consolidated school of their city, last week.

Grand Deputy, W. H. Hogan, of the C.M.B.A. was in the city Saturday. He had been visiting Branch 333, Ver-noo River upon request, and reports the affairs of the Branch to be in a very prosperous condition.

John Burns, dredging contractor, of Ottawa, arrived in the city last evening. He is at present constructing a dredge for the Dominion government to be used in Prince Edward Island, where considerable work is to be done by the department of public works in the near future. The dredge which will cost in the vicinity of \$25,000, will be left permanently in Prince Edward Island.—St. John Telegraph.

Rev. Dr. Heartz preached at the evening services in Bridgetown last Sunday. Special services were held, celebrating the thirty-ninth year of the organization of Providence Church in that town. Bridgetown exchanges speak very highly of the able address given by Dr. Heartz at the evening service. Dr. Heartz was formerly pastor of the Baptist Church at Bridgetown.—Amherst Ex. (Dr. Heartz is well known here.)

A. Young, of C. & W. Hackett, returned last night from Big Harbor, Victoria, Co., where he had been looking after the interests of the insurance company carrying the risk on the schooner Charming Lass. Mr. Young found the schooner full of water and so badly damaged that she will have to be abandoned. The vessel was bound to Prince Edward Island with 45 tons of coal when she went ashore. She is an old vessel, having been built at Herring Neck, Nfld., twenty-eight years ago, and is 67 tons register. Her owner is G. A. Poole of P. E. Island.—Sydney Ex.

In a lecture in this city recently before the Fruit Growers' Association Dr. C. Gordon Hewitt, Dominion Entomologist, spoke at length on insect pests. He showed that Canada showed an annual loss of \$50,000,000. The brown tail moth he considered the most destructive of orchard pests and so far as city dwellers were concerned directly, he considered the tussock moth the most serious because of its great defoliating capacity. He then went on to discuss the natural history of these pests and then to outline what the Dominion and provincial governments were doing to combat them, and finally what this city should do.

With respect to the tussock moth he showed that the parasite was an important factor in dealing with it, and, contrary to popular impression, the parasite was not harmful. If it succeeded in exterminating the moth, it did not turn its attention to other things, but disappeared with the moth. Dr Hewitt showed the importance of using these natural means of control, but he said we could not depend upon them entirely. The best time to combat the tussock moth, he said, was in the winter when the egg masses were conspicuous and could be easily destroyed by either being collected and burned or else by being touched with creosote. By painting a band of tanglefoot four inches in width around the trunks of trees caterpillars would be prevented from getting up to the foliage. In this way the foliage would be safe for that year, and the female, being unable to fly, would not be able to get up into the trees to lay eggs that would hatch out another year. Then also, it was advisable to spray the foliage with an arsenical solution.

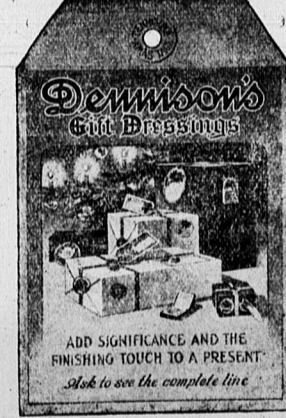
