The stock market rally bogged down in spots today after yesterday's bulge was extended moderately in early dealings.

Only changes in Canadian stocks were in the big board issues, International Nickel lost 1-4, Walkers 3-8 while Dome gained 1-8.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks finished with a loss of .11 or 39.350 Monday.

RINGS PREVENT PLUGGED PIPES

Considerable progress has been made by the plumbing industry in recent years in finding a solution for the problem created by the stoppage of sewers by tree roots, the Plumbing and Heating Industries Bureau reports.

A new device which provides a means of keeping roots out of clay and cement sewer pipes is now available. This consists of a ring of copper placed in the bell of each joint.

A light film of poisonous copper salts is formed on the copper rings by the moisture in the sewer and by the acids and gases. It is said that tree roots cannot pass through the poisonous film formed by these green salts. The health of the tree or bush is not affected.

While pipe rings are utilized in preventing the spread of roots in existing sewers, in new installations the use of cast iron pipe will offer positive and permanent protection.
