MORE THAN 3,000 LIVES LOST IN EARTHQUAKE.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—More than 3,000 lives were lost in the earthquake in the province of Konia, Turkey, Oct. 5, according to a cablegram from Ambassador Morgenthau, to the State Department.

Thousands of buildings were destroyed, rendering countless numbers of people homeless. Ambassador Morgenthau was unofficially requested by the Minister of the Interior of the Turkish Government to solicit help from the people of the United States through the Red Cross and other organizations, as the Turkish people were declared to be so impoverished that they rendered practically no assistance to their suffering compatriots.
