THE COOK'S CORNER

HONEY TARTS Line small tart tins with flaky pastry and fill with the following mixture: 1/2 cup butter, 4 tablespoons honey, 2 tablespoons crystallized ginger, 1/4 cup walnuts, 1/4 cup dates. Cream the butter thoroughly and work into it the honey until well blended. Chop the ginger, dates and nuts as finely as possible and blend into the mixture. Mix well and put up your tartlets in a very hot oven of about 425 deg. Fahr. The mixture bubbles up and forms a kind of syrup on the edges of the tarts and is probably the coating to which you are referring.

FOR DIPPING CAKES

Cakes for dipping must first be baked. To glaze cakes, beat white of one egg slightly, and add 1 tablespoon powdered sugar. Apply with brush to top and sides of cakes. After glazing, cakes should stand overnight before dipping. To dip cakes, melt fondant by placing in top of double boiler and color and flavor as desired. Stir to prevent a crust from forming on top. Take cake to be dipped on a three-tined fork and lower in fondant 3/4 the depth of the cake. Remove from fondant, invert, and slip from fork to a board to dry out.
