CANADA'S OLDEST EDITOR.

The title belongs to Sir Mackenzie Bowell, of the Belleville Intelligencer, and ex-Premier of Canada. In the Busy Man's Magazine for September, G. W. Brock tells about him. He came to Canada from Suffolk, England, a poor boy with his father in 1833. In 1834 he entered the office of the Intelligencer, asked for and obtained a position as "devil."

"A few days ago," writes Mr. Brock, "I found him in the sanctum pen in hand, writing an article on the political situation in the Maritime Provinces. He sits erect and as he walks to and fro from work even a stranger could not fail to observe the pleasant countenance, soldierly bearing, stately appearance and sprightly step of the venerable knight."

Once, long ago, just as he had completed his apprenticeship as a printer, he thought of leaving the employ of Mr. Benjamin and told him so. "He did not want me to go," said Sir Mackenzie. "He said he was getting old, and if I would remain I could take the entire management of the office, pay all the running expenses and have half the profits. He would attend to the editorial work and would not ask me to invest a cent in the business. This I considered a generous proposition and was not long in accepting it. That evening I went to see my fiancée and told her of the unexpected offer made me by Mr. Benjamin. She was delighted to hear the good news. I declared my prospects were now so good that I thought we could get married, and the happy event came off a few weeks later."

Sir Mackenzie Bowell has been in politics to, these forty-five years past, but was unsuccessful in his first contest in 1863. He set in the Commons for one seat from 1867 to 1892 when he was made a Senator. He was made Minister of Customs in 1878, which office he held for 18 years, and was afterwards Minister of Trade and Commerce. After serving in the cabinets of Sir John Macdonald, Sir John Abbott and Sir John Thompson he became Premier on Sir John

Thompson's death. In April, 1896 he yielded that position to Sir Charles Tupper. Sir Charles and Sir Mackenzie are the only surviving ex-Premiers of Canada, the former in his 88th year and the latter in his 86th year. "Do you see this watch?" asked the veteran journalist of Mr. Brock. "It is fifty years old—an English gold watch given to me by my brethren of Hastings County on the 12th of July, 1857." A part of the inscription reads: "In testimony of their respect for him as a man." The veteran editor and ex-Premier has solid abilities and worth without being brilliant. He is widely known and respected as a public man of the better class, clean and honest and all the newspaper men are proud of him as the oldest working journalist in Canada.

Mr. Taff the Republican candidate for President has his summer home at Murray Bay, Quebec.

The St. John Globe, Liberal, referring to the coming election, says: "It is quite apparent that the whole political ground will be closely fought, and very few men will be elected by acclamation."

Canada has the largest continuous wheatfield in the world and the largest flour mill also. This is the Ogilvie mill in Montreal which can turn out 4,400 barrels of flour in twenty-four hours, enough to feed as many people for a year.

A meeting of ministers in Saint John has condemned Mayor Bullock for issuing a license for a public exhibition of pugilism. It is not an edifying sight to see two bruisers pounding each other. Such a show calls together and gratifies the baser element of a city, but ought not to be licensed or tolerated.

Black paper and white ink is one of the innovations that is being experimented with. It is said to be quite as easily readable as the black type on the white paper, and would save millions of dollars yearly, as old newspapers, now worthless could be remade into black paper.

Adulterations of maple sugar and maple syrup have long been common. Last year the inland revenue inspectors tested some 500 samples and found seventy-seven were not pure. That was about one in seven. Some dealers were prosecuted we are told and this year tests found fourteen cases of adulteration in 142 samples, or one in ten. This shows some improvement in the ratio but not much, and with less than one third of the number of tests made last year.

I then went home, slept sound in bed, Next morn I heard my mother's tread; "Is that you John, have you got home?" That's me; you know I said I'd come.

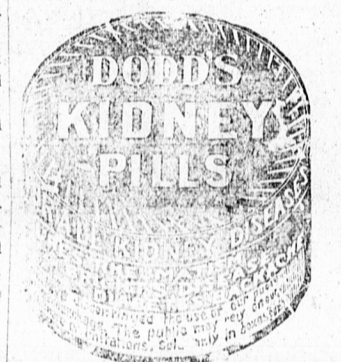
I then got up and breakfast o'er Ben and I called on F. S. Moore; We then around the ruins walked, And there about the great fire talked.
