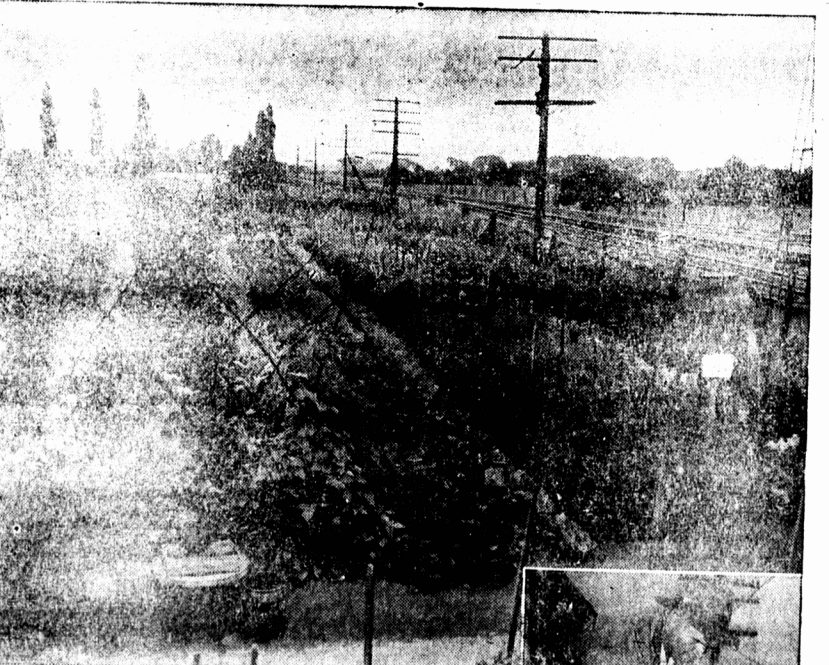

Championship Victory Garden Helps Feed Family of 18



NEAR-PERFECT SCORE: The 200 by 50 foot plot (above), which has been adjudged the best victory garden on the Island of Montreal this year, helps feed the eight grown children and eight grand-children of Joseph Totta (next) section foreman for the Canadian Pacific Railway at Montreal West. Totta works an hour before going on duty at 7 a.m. and three hours after quitting time at 4 p.m. In growing 22 different vegetables, many of which Mrs. Totta canned or put down, she has been supplementing the commercially grown vegetable supply needed to alleviate the food shortage in Europe. Judges for The Montreal Star contest which Totta won, called his garden "without doubt the finest vegetable garden ever entered in the competition" and gave him 28 out of a possible 30 points for quality. They looked in vain for weeds and pests and particularly remarked on his four-inch-deep cultivation, a valuable aid in moisture conservation.
