HALIFAX, February 20.—According to what local shippers say, the cattle markets on the other side are in a very bad shape. Recent shipments to Glasgow particularly have turned out badly, and one lot of cattle lost as much as \$15 a head. 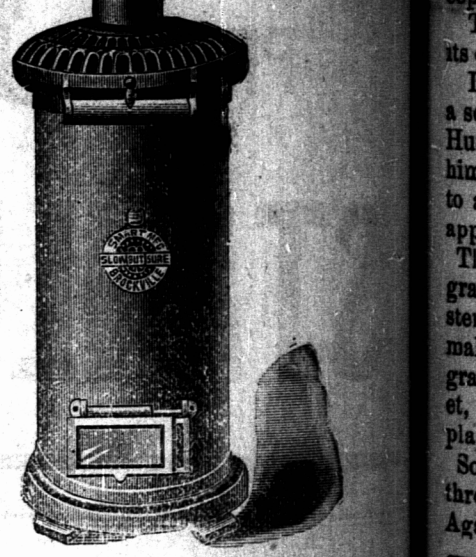
