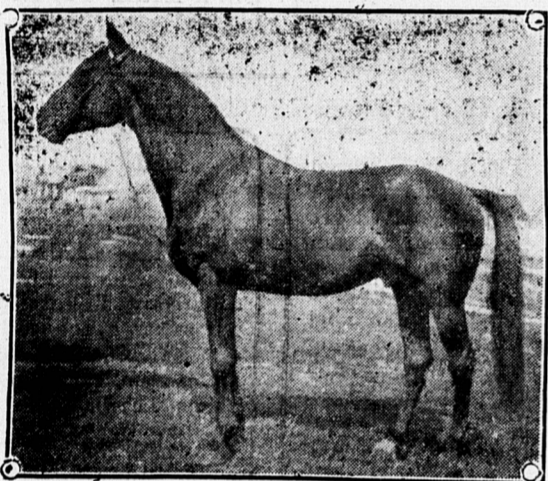

—The man Adams who fell from the staging of Holman's new coal shed, is reported as well as can be expected.

—W. H. and Leslie Taylor, N. Y., and brother Albert of Bangor, left Summerside for their home Monday morning.

—J. Maynard Waite, New York, left yesterday morning after a short visit to friends at the old home, Wilnot Valley.

—It was eight not eighty horses that were shipped by the Empress Tuesday morning. The error was made in taking item by telephone.

—The Town Council of Summerside has received a letter from M. J. Butler re the matter of supplying water to the railway at Summerside. He says the commission cannot consider the matter at the price named—as they are now getting a water supply at \$108. A little more than 1-3 the price asked by the town.

—The young people of "Perseverance" Mission Band, Belvedere, held a most enjoyable ice cream and strawberry festival on the grounds of Mrs. Sweetser on Friday, July 16. The day was all that could be desired, and the large number of people present seemed to enjoy themselves to the full. Ice cream, home made candy and strawberries were sold and the sum of \$41.25 realized.

—A valuable horse belonging to Ellis Bradshaw, Middleton, was gored by a vicious cow a few days ago. The entrails protruded some 14 inches from the rupture. The neighbors gathered around and some thoughtful person amongst them suggested that a large pan be procured. This filled with warm water and a little cathartic added, was held in such a position that the protruding bowel was kept at blood heat until a V. S. arrived from Summerside, when the animal was thrown and the bowel replaced and the necessary stitching done. At last report the animal was doing all right. P. E. I. farmers are not too slow.

—The following report was inadvertently omitted from The Guardian yesterday. A meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade, was held Tuesday night. President Stewart and quite a large number were present. The first question taken up was the matter of dredging the harbor. After some discussion the following committee was appointed to arrange as to where the dredge should commence work when she arrived. M. J. McLellan and Roy Holman representing the town, Ronald Campbell, John Matheson, Harbor Master, and Capt. J. L. Read to represent the Board of Trade. The discussion of excessive Insurance Rates paid by property holders in Summerside was brought up and a number of communications were read from different small towns in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, which went to show that they were enjoying the advantage of cheaper rates than Summerside. A committee composed of J. S. Hinton, W. K. McGowan and Creel McArthur was appointed to confer with the Board of Underwriters on this matter. The meeting very much regretted the action taken by the railway commissioners in refusing to take their supply of water from the town water system, and decided to again bring the matter before the commissioners.

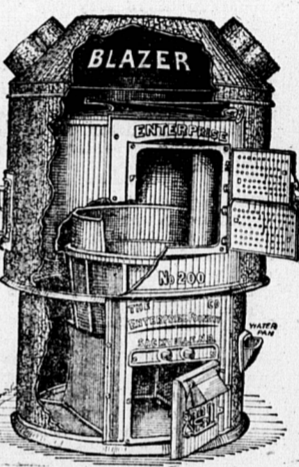
BUFFALO, July 18.—There are more than 1,000,000 boys and girls in the United States who are working, when they ought to be at school or out in the fresh air. This terrible fact was revealed to the National Association of Charities and Correctness, in convention here.

"Save these children!" is the slogan of the national child labor committee which has revealed remarkable abuses of child labor laws throughout the country.

Everett W. Lord, former school director in Porto Rico found in New England alone 5000 children between ten and fourteen who couldn't read or write.

"Temptation and vice go hand in hand," he says. "Boys and girls exposed to the factory and the streets are in grave danger."

Schools for these little toilers and calls in the penitentiary for their greedy bosses are remedies the committee would like to see applied. Man like Lord says, lies in better laws and in better men to enforce the laws already made. In Maine, for instance, there is only one factory inspector and he had no assistant. Factories have increased many times over, but the same provision is made by the state that was in force ten years ago.
