"Dorothy Lamour" At The Capitol

A romance in the heart of the Malayan jungle between a white man lost in the wilderness and a girl who had never seen a white man before is the story of action-packed "The Jungle Princess," which begins today at the Capitol Theatre.

Dorothy Lamour, whose golden voice has captivated the nation on the radio, makes her film debut in this picture as the girl of the jungle whose only companion is a full-grown man-eating tiger and a giant chimpanzee. Ray Milland plays the part of the explorer in the Malay jungle who is saved by the girl and then falls in love with her.

Thrills in large measure are furnished in "The Jungle Princess" by a stampeding elephant herd, the battle between a man and a tiger, the fight to the death between a tiger and a leopard and the destruction of a Malay village by a herd of baboons. Miss Lamour sings a Malay cradle song during the course of the picture.

"Jungle Princess" is a beautifully produced and directed thrill-film, especially notable for introducing a new beauty to the screen in the lovely person of Dorothy Lamour.

"Big City" At Prince Edward

"Big City," an original story opened yesterday at the Prince Edward Theatre, with Louise Rainer and Spencer Tracy, co-starred.

There is no crude attempt to reveal the machinery of metropolitan life as a whole. On the contrary, it is a cunningly unique story of a single slice of life in a great city and the adventures of a taxi driver in a struggle to survive.

Tracy, the good priest in "San Francisco" and later the Portuguese fisherman in "Captains Courageous," becomes the husky-voiced, cynical hackman, bold to the point of dare-devilry, fair and square and a hard man in a battle. Miss Rainer, Academy Award winner as an immigrant girl who is his wife and soon to be the mother of his child.

The story is powerful and the acting is equal to it. An excellent supporting cast includes Charley Grapewin, Janet Beecher, Eddie Quillan, Victor Varconi, Oscar O'Shea, Helen Troy, William Demarest, John Arledge, Irving Bacon, Quinn Williams and Regis Toomey.

MONTREAL, May 27.—The railways of Canada will offer this summer special 21 day limit round trip excursion fares from points in central Canada to stations in eastern Quebec, the Atlantic and the Gulf of St. Lawrence according to C. P. Riddell chairman, Canadian Passenger Association.

"These 21-day round-trip excursions will afford an opportunity to visit the many delightful resorts which the eastern part of Canada hold for the summer traveler in search of recreation by the shore and inland bay or at attractive inland centres." These excursions will be in operation from June 15 to Sept. 5 inclusive and will apply from Montreal eastward also from stations in the province of Quebec as far east as Montreal. Tourists may use coaches or in standard sleeping cars or parlor cars upon payment of regular charges for such accommodation.
