TO THE CREAMERY PATRONS OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

GENTLEMEN: Since paying for cream on the basis of grade is the only effective method of improving the quality of butter, the creamery managers and secretaries have been notified to enforce the regulations embodied in the Cream Grading Act still more effectively this summer than in the past.

The Cream Grading Act provides that all cream delivered, sold or purchased by any creamery shall be "graded" as to quality, and payment shall be made upon the basis of this grading.

The grades of cream and qualifications of grade shall be as follows: (a) Special grade shall include any lot of cream which is clean in flavor, of a uniform consistency and fit for making into special grade butter.

(b) First grade shall include any lot of cream which is clean in flavor, of uniform consistency and fit for making butter of this grade. Its acidity shall not be more than .55 per cent (fifty five one hundredths of one per cent) at the time of grading at the Creamery where it is to be manufactured into butter and shall contain not less than 20 per cent butter fat.

(c) Second grade shall include any lot of cream that does not meet with the requirements specified for the next higher grade, or which is bitter, stale, musty, metallic, fermented or otherwise unclean in flavor, and any lot of such cream may, at the discretion of the Manager or the Dairy Inspector or his representative, be returned to its original owner.

A premium of not less than two cents per pound butter fat shall be paid by any creamery for special grade cream over first grade cream and a premium of not less than three cents per pound butter fat shall be paid by any Creamery for first grade cream over second grade cream.

But if the market price of Special Grade Cream reaches fifty than three cents per pound butterfat, then a premium of not less than three cents per pound butterfat shall be paid by any Creamery for Special grade cream over First Grade Cream, and a premium of not less than four cents per pound butterfat shall be paid by any creamery for First Grade cream over Second grade cream.

These provisions will be in force from this date henceforth. They are in accordance with similar regulations in other provinces of Canada.

Officials of the Agricultural Department will strictly enforce these regulations and in cases where non-observance of said regulations are reported, the penalties as provided under the Act will be strictly applied.

We ask the fullest co-operation of all cream producers, in the production of highest quality cream.
