Premier Drew of Ontario has contributed a valuable suggestion for eliminating friction in the field of social planning and reconstruction.

The need for some such body is apparent. It will become more so as time goes on and it becomes necessary to deal with various enactments for social security and the like.

Canada's Federal system is solidly founded, and it has been proven through 77 years of experience. It must be carefully safeguarded, and any attempt to destroy it must be resisted.
