J. J. HUGHES ON TRANSPORTATION

(Continued from page 1.) of Railways and Canals (Mr. Cochrane) will have more to do with it. I ask these hon. gentlemen to give it the earliest possible attention they can, and if they do that I will promise them that in so far as that is concerned they will have my support. Now, I wish to say a word with regard to the question of our contribution to the imperial navy. I believe it is the well understood desire of the constituents I represent that we should do our duty. They are quite willing to do their duty and to contribute their fair share towards the maintenance of the imperial navy, towards making a contribution in whatever form it may be decided to make it in order to make that navy supreme upon the ocean. The people of the maritime provinces, in so far as I could ascertain their views, were strongly in favor of the policy laid down by the late administration. That policy was well presented by the present hon. Minister of Trade and Commerce (Mr. Foster). These ships were to be constructed in our own ports, as far as possible by our own workmen and out of our own material and manned by Canadians. In that respect we would have a vital interest in it because incidentally it might and probably would encourage commercial shipbuilding and give to

the maritime provinces in the construction of steel ships that preeminently of course is in the construction of wooden ships. It would assist greatly in building up cities at some of our ocean ports and therefore give a market to our farmers and fishermen. Inasmuch as we are situated on the coast of the great lakes and the St. Lawrence to a still greater extent our own markets and the policy of the late government in that respect would certainly have been of great advantage to the shipbuilding interests of the country. In these few words I have endeavored to present my views and the views of my constituents upon these matters and I ask again the Minister of Marine and Fisheries to give his serious and prompt attention to the grave question of transportation between Prince Edward Island and the mainland. That question is of vital importance to us. I would ask him to take the earliest opportunity of having a proper survey made in order to ascertain whether or not a tunnel is feasible. If it is found to be not feasible then we want another sister ship to the "Lady Grey" that will give us as constant communication as possible between that province and the mainland, and above and beyond all we want equality of traffic rates. We want to be able to send our produce from Prince Edward Island at the same rate per mile as people are enabled to transport their produce on the mainland.

Mr. STANFIELD. Why did not your party give you that? Mr. HUGHES. Our party did a good deal towards that. They did not do all, and a good deal remains for this party to do. Our party, when they came into power, found one steamer plying between Prince Edward Island and the mainland—the "Stanley." The Liberal party provided a sister steamer called the "Minto," and later on they provided a third steamer, the "Earl Grey." That was doing a good deal but they did not take hold of the question of transportation rates as they should have done, and as I hope this government will do.

Pending the construction of the tunnel, if it is found to be feasible, a sister ship to the "Earl Grey" is much needed, and I hope the government will take that into consideration. I repeat that we should have equal transportation rates for equal distances, that we may be put upon an equality with the people on the mainland. That is not asking too much, and I believe the people on the mainland will concede it to us. We ought to be able to ship our produce from Prince Edward Island to the markets of Ontario at the same rates as the people of Ontario can ship their produce into our market. The Minister of Marine is a maritime province man and I think he will agree with me that that proposition is a fair one, and I trust he will do all he can to bring this condition of things about.
