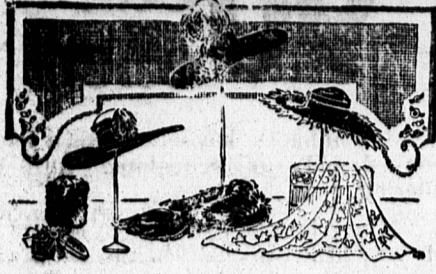

thority must have had excellent reasons for the step taken.

The younger officers and all the men were sent off in drafts to France. On their arrival there many highly complimentary reports were sent back regarding the splendid condition of the men and their evident high state of training.

Unfortunately the older and more senior officers found it extremely difficult to be placed on account of their age and seniority. A number of them have returned to Canada and some have gone back to civilian life.

The authorities declined to allow Col. Ings to go again to France on account of his age. He was offered permanent employment in England but requested to be allowed to return to Canada.

After the break-up of the 5th Division, Col. Ings was attached to Bramshott headquarters, and for a period was employed in taking drafts to France. He made application to transfer to the Imperial Army but was told by a high official that they already had over one hundred surplus lieutenant-colonels and a still larger number of majors—all surplus on account of age.

A great many of the older officers are continually being sent back from France to make way for younger men.

Major Garnett Hughes, who had command of the 5th Division was very much admired and respected by all ranks and the high state of efficiency attained by the Division was due largely to his ability and thoroughness.

Before leaving England Col. Ings applied in writing for an appointment in the Siberian contingent, offering to revert to Lieutenant.

His eldest son Lieut. Walter Ings of the Royal Engineers is at present serving in France with the 3rd Imperial Division.

## GERMAN OWNED FURS SOLD IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Sept. 19.—Over a million and quarter pelts, valued at about three million dollars were placed on show here today, they are to be sold at the annual fall auction of raw furs that is to be held in the Masonic Temple here beginning on Monday next. Several thousand of them are German owned and are to be sold for the account of Aliens property by Custodian Mitchell Palmer.

While the general collection is smaller than that offered at the spring sale of the New York Fur Auction Sales Corporation here last April there is no scarcity of foxes, Marten, Lynx and other fancy furs.

There is however a shortage of the so called staple furs including Raccoon, Opossum, Skunk and Muskrat and especially of the last two varieties. Prices at the sale are expected to establish new high records in many cases.

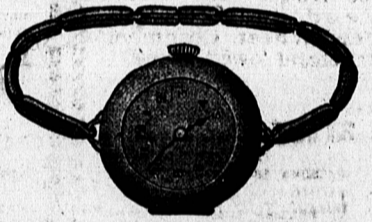

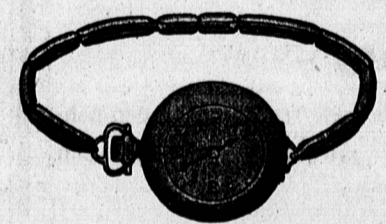
